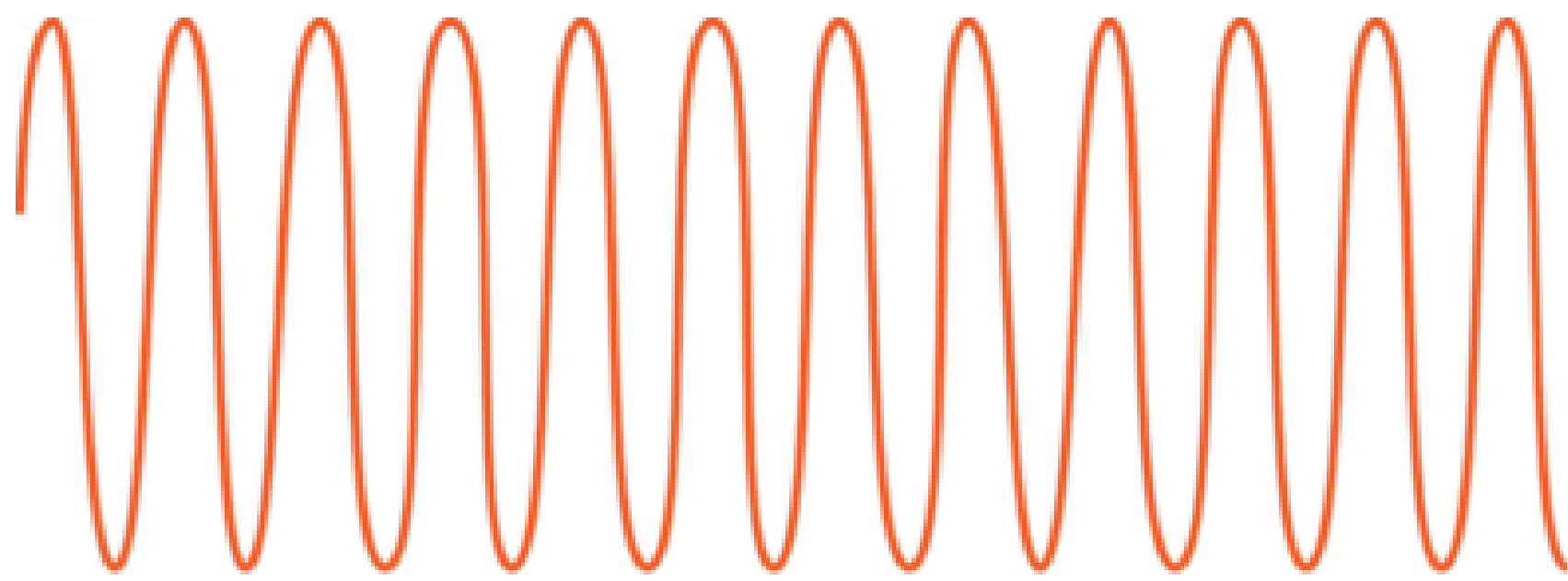

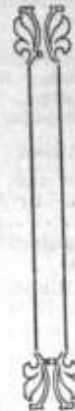
BEFORE THE LEAVES ARE TURNING.

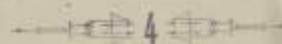
