## LII. Strong and Weak Believers in Unity - Pt 3 - Please One Another as Christ Did

- A. God's Design for Unity
  - 1. OT
- a. David's Teaching Ps 133:1
- b. The Prophet's Teachings Jer 32:38-39; Ez 36:16-17; Hos 1:11; Zeph 3:9; 14:9
- 2. NT
- a. The Gospels Jo 10:16
- b. The Epistles Ac 2; 1 Co 1:10; 12:12-13; Gal 3:26-28; Eph 4:2-6; Phil 1:27; 2:2; Col 3:11-14; 1 Pe 3:8; 1 Jo 1:7; 3:16-18; 4:11, 20-21
- B. Bearing with the Scruples of the Weak vs 1a
  - 1. Receiving one another with understanding 14:1-12
  - 2. Building up one another w/o offending 14:13-23
  - 3. responsibility of "We who are strong"
    - a. *opheilo* to owe; to be under obligation (ought, must, should); morally, to fail in duty:--behove, be bound, (be) debt(-or), (be) due(-ty), be guilty (indebted), (must) need(-s), ought, owe, should.
      - i. Heb 5:3 refers to the high priest obligate to offer sacrifices for sins, the peoples, his own
      - ii. 1 Jo 2:6; 3:16; 4:11 refers to a believer's obligation to walk like Christ
    - b. *bastazo* to lift, (endure, declare, sustain, receive, etc.):--bear, carry, take up. i. of a pitcher of water Mk 14:13
      - ii. Of a man Ac 21:35
      - iii. A yoke of obligation Ac 15:10
    - c. the scruples of the weak
      - i. not just to tolerate
      - ii. To help carry them
        - not by being critical or condescending
        - by showing respect for views with which we disagree Phil 2:3-4
      - iii. Not to please men, but to win them Gal 1:10; 1 Co 9:19-22
- B. Not Pleasing Ourselves vs 1b-2
  - 1. liberty is not for oneself
  - 2. Let each of us please his neighbor
    - a. Let each of us ne exemptions
    - b. the objective 1Co 10:24,33
      - i. to promote his good
      - ii. leading to edification
- C. Being Like Christ vs 3
  - 1. For even Christ did not please Himself; Mt 26:39; Jo 5:30; 6:38
    - a. what His person could have demanded Phil 2:6a
    - b. what He chose to do Phil 2:6b-8

- 2. but as it is written, "The reproaches of those who reproached You fell on Me." Ps 69:9;
  - a. the mindset change for the believer Phil 2:5
  - b. the extent to which the mindset goes 2 Co 5:21
- D. Hope in the Scriptures vs 4
  - 1. For whatever things were written before were written for our learning,
    - a. obviously referring to divinely revealed truths in the OT
      - i. Inspiration 2Ti 3:16-17
      - ii. Human writers carried by the Spirit 2Pe 1:20-21
    - b. they are still valuable for us 1 Co 10:6-11
      - i. *didaskalia* instruction (the function or the information):--doctrine, learning, teaching.
      - ii. tupos a die (as struck), a stamp or scar; a shape, a statue, style or resemblance; a sampler ("type"), a model (for imitation) or instance (for warning):--en-(ex-)ample, fashion, figure, form, manner, pattern, print.
      - iii. *nouthesia* calling attention to, mild rebuke or warning:--admonition.
  - 2. that we through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope.
    - a. patience *hupomone* cheerful (or hopeful) endurance, constancy, enduring, patience, patient continuance (waiting). Ro 5:3; Jas 1:2-3
    - b. comfort *paraklesis* imploration, hortation, solace:--comfort, consolation, exhortation, intreaty. Ro 5:4; Heb 12:5
    - c. hope elpis expectation, confidence:--faith, hope. Ro 5:4-5; 15:13; Ga 5:5
- E. Dependence on God's Power vs 5
  - 1. Now may the God of patience and comfort
    - a. what God expects from us, He provides for us
    - b. He sovereignly brings trials into ones life to develop patience Jas 1:2-3
    - c. He give comfort in the midst of trials so that we can give comfort to others 2 Co 1:3-6
  - 2. grant you to be like-minded toward one another, according to Christ Jesus,
    - a. Paul's prayer for them that God would grant
    - b. as with patience and comfort, what God expects, He provides
    - c. Paul's call here is to be of the same mind in areas of Christian liberty
      - i. to be loving, not judgmental
      - ii. Considerate of the weaker brother
- F. Glorifying God with One Accord vs 6
  - 1. that you may with one mind and one mouth
    - a. with nothing that causes divisiveness between the members
    - b. mouth *stoma* the mouth; language (and its relations)
  - 2. glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.
