"Dig and Do"

- A. "Dig into God's Word"—Nehemiah 8:13-15
 - 1. The Digging: "to understand"—or "gain insight"
 - 2. The Discovery: Feast of Tabernacles or Booths
 - a. Scripture: Leviticus 23:39-43
 - b. "Spiritual Vacation" in Jerusalem
 - c. Significance:
 - 1) Looks back—reminder of God's care and protection
 - 2) Looks around—reflect on God's blessing and provision—Exodus 23:116
 - 3) Looks ahead—anticipation of Messianic kingdom Zechariah 14:4-5,9-11, 16
 - 3. The Neglect: Haven't observed it in close to 100 years—Ezra 3:4
- B. "Do what it says"—Nehemiah 8:14-18
 - 1. Two Stages:
 - a. Preparation Stage—v. 14-15
 - b. Participation Stage—vv. 16-18
 - 1) Possible Excuses as to why "Not now"
 - 2) Obeying God's Word at time does appear foolish and involves sacrifice and cost.
 - Results: Great JOY Nehemiah 8:17-18

Application:

- 1. For you and I to be blessed and restored, we need to dig into God's Word and do what it says! James 1:22-25
- 2. Take a cue from the Jewish feasts and consider planning a "spiritual vacation" where your soul could be strengthened and encouraged.
