An extreme case of wicked, willful denial of the truth: The religious leaders of the Sanhedrin

"When they heard this, they were enraged and wanted to kill them." (v33)

Acts 9:22-23

What's going on here?

Rejecters of Jesus Christ detest godly men and women who wear His garment of righteousness.

"The wicked plots against the righteous and gnashes his teeth at him." Psalm 37:12

"The wicked watches for the righteous and seeks to put him to death." Psalm 37:32

Psalm 37:14-15

Jesus addressed the murderous, religious hypocrites: Matthew 23:34-36

"The problem with preachers today is that nobody wants to kill them." Steve Lawson

Gamaliel's 'do nothing,' 'wait-and-see' advice: vv34-39

'Choose you this day'; 'who do you say that I am?'

2 Corinthians 6:1-3

"He who hesitates is lost"

In other words, a person who spends too much time mired in doubt, dithering about what to do, risks losing the opportunity to act altogether.
