TICK, TOCK, IT'S GOD'S CLOCK Ecclesiastes 3:1-15 Sermon 5

Introduction: Key word of Ecclesiastes is $\underline{\text{HeBeL}}$ (breath or vapor). The Hebrews invented "Roman" numerals before the Romans. The letters of the alphabet have a numeric value. And *hebel*'s numeric value is calculated by adding "H" – 5, "B" – 2, and "L" – 30 = 37. HeBeL occurs 37 x's in Ecclesiastes. There are exactly 1491 words in the first half of the book and 1491 words in the second half. And there are 111 verses in each half (3 X 37 =111). Solomon's masterpiece is all about HeBeL! Life is short; it will be gone before you know it. Therefore . . .

Proposition: It's time to wake up and see time the way God does.

Interrogative: Why do we need to wake up?
