DISABLED THROUGH DEMONIC DISBELIEF

Matthew 12:22-45

I. Through demonic disbelief, the Pharisees are spiritually mute (vv. 22-37).
II. Through demonic disbelief, the Pharisees are spiritually blind (vv. 38-45).

QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

- 1. What was wrong with the man Jesus healed? How did he serve as a picture of the Pharisees?
- 2. In response to the amazement of the crowds, what did the Pharisees say about Christ's exorcism of demons?
- 3. According to Jesus, what are His miracles evidence of? In light of that, how ought people to respond?
- 4. What is the unpardonable sin of vv. 31-32? How does the broader context help us to understand it?
- 5. Why will we be judged for every word we speak? Does this teach that we are saved by our words and works?
- 6. What is the sign that the Pharisees will be given? What does Jonah's life and ministry have to do with Christ's life and ministry?
- 7. Why are we worse off if we hear the gospel and harden our hearts against it than if we never heard the gospel at all?

QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

- 1. How would I counsel someone who is fearful that they have committed the unpardonable sin?
- 2. Am I careless with my words? What do my words reveal about my heart, especially the words I speak in private?
- 3. Which of Christ's illustrations in this passage particularly strikes or challenges me? Why?
