WHAT CHANGE LOOKS LIKE

	<i>Word</i>	<i>Definition</i>
	FAITH	The foundation of the Christian life is <i>faith</i> —personal conviction in the biblical Jesus that leads to life commitment.
1	VIRTUE	Growth in rightly ordered affections to love what God loves and to loathe what God loathes.
2	KNOWLEDGE	Growth in wisdom—in understanding what the Bible says and how it applies to your life.
3	SELF-CONTROL	Growth in the ability to control your body and mind—work and rest, eating and activity, mood and reactions, speech and thoughts.
4	STEADFASTNESS	Growth in enduring hardships—whether trials or persecution or disappointment or failure.
5	GODLINESS	Growth in “living in a way that’s wholly devoted to God” so that “whether you eat or drink...you do all for God’s glory.”
6	BROTHERLY AFFECTION	Growth in sincere affection for and life-affecting friendships with those in your church family.
7	LOVE	Growth in warm, self-sacrificial commitment to others for God’s glory and their good.
