

"Be Careful What You Wish For!" Habakkuk Part 7

I Text:

Old Covenant: *Habakkuk 3:1-6*

New Covenant: *Luke 1:46-56*

II Doctrine: God gives the Prophet a prayer to be sung and memorized by the people. Using song as a mnemonic device is not original in scripture. Habakkuk is completely in line with the will of God. He has been thoroughly humbled by the wisdom and power of the almighty, and declares it. The living God and his Son Jesus Christ move and shape history. God will rule according to his will with both covenant keepers and breakers, "falling in line".

III Comparing Scripture With Scripture:

1) .God gives the Prophet a prayer to be sung and memorized by the people. Using song as a mnemonic device is not original in scripture. (*Habakkuk 3:1; Psalm 90:1; Deuteronomy 32:1*)

2) Habakkuk is completely in line with the will of God. He has been thoroughly humbled by the wisdom and power of the almighty, and declares it! (*Habakkuk 3:2-4; Psalm 90:2-4; Deuteronomy 32:2-4*)

3) The living God and his Son Jesus Christ move and shape history. God will rule according to his will with both covenant keepers and breakers, "falling in line". (*Habakkuk 3:5,6; Psalm 90:5,6; Deuteronomy 32:5,6; Luke 1:46-56*)

Definition of mnemonic (Entry 1 of 2)

1: assisting or intended to assist memory

To distinguish "principal" from "principle" use the mnemonic aid "the principal is your pal."

also : of or relating to mnemonics

2: of or relating to memory
