3. Peacemaking: The Four G's

1) **G**lorify God

- Trust God, Psa 37:1,3,5
- Obey God
- Imitate God, Luke 6:35, Eph 4:31-5:1
- 2) Get an Eye Check-up
 - Get the log out of your eye, Matt 7:3-5
 - Get Some Perspective, Prov 19:11, 1 Pet 4:8, Eph 4:1-2, Col 3:13
 - Get a Look at the Consequences, Matt 5:25-26
- 3) **G**ently Restore

Gal 5:22-23,26, 6:1. Compare Matt 18:15, cf vv 11-13, vv 21-22

4) **G**o and Be Reconciled

Matt 6:12, Eph 4:32, Col 3:13
