# The main point of Hebrews 5:11–6:8

Christians (especially suffering Christians!) must pursue maturity and be terrified of falling away.

#### A rebuke, a Challenge, & a Warning Hebrews 5:11 – 6:8

- 1. Christian, you may need rebuke for immaturity (5:11–14).
- 2. Christian, accept the challenge to pursue maturity (6:1–3).
- 3. Christian, heed the warning about falling away (6:4–8).

  - <u>The Bible is full of severe warnings to true</u> <u>Christians about falling away (Hebrews 2:3; 3:12-</u> 13; 4:1, 11; etc.; 1 Corinthians 15:1-5).
