Revised Relationships in Christ

Colossians 3:18-4:1

- ¹⁸ Wives, submit to your husbands, as is fitting in the Lord.
- ¹⁹ Husbands, love your wives, and do not be harsh with them.
- ²⁰ Children, obey your parents in everything, for this pleases the Lord. ²¹ Fathers, do not provoke your children, lest they become discouraged.
- ²² Bondservants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters, not by way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, fearing the Lord.
- ²³ Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, ²⁴ knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ.
- ²⁵ For the wrongdoer will be paid back for the wrong he has done, and there is no partiality.
- ¹ Masters, treat your bondservants justly and fairly, knowing that you also have a Master in heaven.

Renewed Relationships

- * Knowing the facts of our faith in our heads is not enough
- Our lives must demonstrate the reality of our faith
- Christ's power in us has a dramatic impact on the kind and quality of relationships we share with one another
- Relationships in the home (husbands/wives; parents/children; masters/slaves) are all transformed by our new identity and our new orientation in Christ

Ground Rules for All Relationships

- ❖ Every Spirit-filled believer needs to be a humble, submissive Christian (Eph 5:21)
- Every believer in Jesus Christ has the same
 - salvation
 - standing before God
 - divine nature and resources
 - divine promises and inheritance
- ❖ No believer is superior to any other believer, but, in matters of role and function, God has made distinctions
- The idea of submitting to authority is a **PROMINENT** feature within the New Testament (Jesus and His Father)

Wives and Husbands

- * "When two men ride a horse, one must ride in front."
- ❖ The submission of wives to husbands is willing and voluntary, just as it is in the case of Christ submitting to the will of His Father
- Submission is NOT
 - putting oneself in the position of being abused or treated as a doormat

- shutting off one's brain, subverting one's gifts or acting as the "silent partner" in the marriage
- * Husbands are to love their wives **CONTINUOUSLY**
 - this involves not only "feelings" of love, honor and respect, it requires the demonstration of them
 - this is done through words **AND** actions
- ❖ Husbands are to love their wives in a self-sacrificial way
 - do not be harsh with them
 - husbands are not to irritate or exasperate their wives, but rather to provide loving leadership in the home

Children and Parents

- ❖ That children are to honor and obey their parents is taught repeatedly in Scripture (Ex 20:12, 21:15-17, Lev 20:9, Deut 21:18-21)
 - unless a parent demands something contrary to God's law, children are to obey their parents in everything
 - the motivation for such obedience is that it *pleases the Lord*
- ❖ Father are not to provoke (*i.e.* exasperate, irritate, nag) their children
- ❖ Exasperating children causes them to lose heart and makes their spirits dry up within them

Slaves and Masters

- The NT accepts slavery as a social reality and seeks to instruct those in that system to behave in a godly manner
 - in our day, these same principles are fully applicable to employee/employer relationships
 - all godly relationships function as a two-way street
 - whichever side of the equation you live on (slave or free) we are to obey God and honor each other in all things
- ❖ Whatever we do must be done with full heart/sincerity
 - however we serve, in whatever we do, we are *serving the*Lord Christ
 - ultimate rewards come from the Lord
