## The Family of Esau Genesis 36:1-37:1

## Main Point:

Instead of envying the wicked for their prosperity, wait patiently for your good things to come.

1. The wicked are alive and well today.

2. The wicked are usually prosperous in this life.

- 3. Because of their prosperity, it can be easy to envy the wicked.
- 4. But it's foolish to envy the wicked because they will one day be judged by God.
- 5. And it's also foolish to envy the wicked because your good things will come eventually.

**Hebrews 12:16** <sup>16</sup> lest there *be* any fornicator or profane person like Esau, who for one morsel of food sold his birthright. (NKJV)

**Psalm 73:3-5, 7** <sup>3</sup> For I was envious of the boastful, When I saw the prosperity of the wicked. <sup>4</sup> For *there are* no pangs in their death, But their strength *is* firm. <sup>5</sup> They are not in trouble as other men, Nor are they plagued like other men ... <sup>7</sup> Their eyes bulge with abundance; They have more than heart could wish. (NKJV)

**Numbers 20:18** <sup>18</sup> Then Edom said to him, "You shall not pass through my *land*, lest I come out against you with the sword." (NKJV)

**Psalm 137:7** Remember, O LORD, against the sons of Edom The day of Jerusalem, Who said, "Raze *it*, raze *it*, To its very foundation!" (NKJV)

**Obadiah 1:1-4** <sup>1</sup> The vision of Obadiah. Thus says the Lord GOD concerning Edom ... <sup>2</sup> "Behold, I will make you small among the nations; You shall be greatly despised ... <sup>4</sup> Though you ascend *as* high as the eagle, And though you set your nest among the stars, From there I will bring you down," says the LORD. (NKJV)

**Psalm 73:16-18** <sup>16</sup> When I thought *how* to understand this, It *was* too painful for me-- <sup>17</sup> Until I went into the sanctuary of God; *Then* I understood their end. <sup>18</sup> Surely You set them in slippery places; You cast them down to destruction. (NKJV)

**Luke 16:24-25** <sup>24</sup> "Then he cried and said, `Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus that he may dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame.' <sup>25</sup> "But Abraham said, `Son, remember that in your lifetime you received your good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things; but now he is comforted and you are tormented. (NKJV)
