- 5. When will this take place (1:7b)?
- 6. What does the text indicated about the character of Christ's return (1:7b)?
- 7. Who will be negatively impacted by Christ's return (1:8)?
- 8. What kind of judgment will these people receive (1:9)?

- What is the length of time that this judgment will impact these people (1:9)?
- 10. What will happen to God's people when Christ returns (1:10)?
- 11. How would the return of Christ have encouraged the Thessalonian church?
- 12. How do you think most people react when they are told about God's final and end of the age judgment?
- 13. When justice and what is right is not upheld, how does the knowledge that God will judge influence you?
- 14. Is it wrong or "sub-Christian" to live obediently to Christ out of fear and respect of a final judgment?
- 15. How does the knowledge that Christ will return motivate and encourage you in the present?
