# "The Shepherd Of The Sheep" John 10:1-6

### **Introduction:**

- 1. Let's Turn Back In Our Bibles:
  - To John 10 This Morning:
    - Where Even Though:
      - We Are Beginning A New Chapter:
        - In This Gospel!
    - It Is Closely Connected To:
      - The Events That Took Place:
        - In The Previous Chapter:
          - Where Jesus Healed:
            - A Man Who Was Born Blind!
  - And As We Just Saw In Chapter 9
    - The Man Was Not Only Healed:
      - Physically He Was Also Healed:
        - Spiritually When In 9:38:
          - He Said To Jesus: "Lord, I Believe!"
            - And Was Saved!

- 2. And Through This:
  - Jesus Taught That There Was A Difference:
    - Between That Man:
      - Who Experienced Jesus' Work:
        - In His Life!
    - And The Pharisees:
      - Who Opposed Jesus' Work:
        - In His Life!
  - The Difference Between:
    - The Man Who Though:
      - He Had Been Blind:
        - In His Eyes!
      - Was Now Able To See:
        - With Both His Eyes & His Heart! And:
    - The Pharisees Who Though:
      - They Could See:
        - With Their Eyes!
      - Were Actually Blind:
        - In Their Hearts!
- 3. And So At The End Of Chapter 9:
  - Jesus Explained To The Now Fully-Healed Man:
    - Why The Pharisees:
      - Responded To Jesus:
        - The Way They Did!
    - It Was Ultimately Because Of:
      - The Callousness & Hardness Of Their Hearts:
        - Because Of Their Sin!
- 4. But Now As We Start Here In Chapter 10:
  - Jesus Explains To The Pharisees:
    - Why The Man Born Blind:
      - Responded To Jesus:
        - The Way *He* Did!
    - It Was Ultimately Because Of:
      - The Change That Was Made In His Heart:
        - By The Grace Of God!
  - A Change That Can Only Take Place:
    - In The Life Of One Of:
      - His Sheep!

- 5. And So In 10:1-6 Jesus Uses:
  - A Special Illustration:
    - To Impress This Truth:
      - Upon All Of Our Hearts!
    - The Truth That:
      - He Alone Is:
        - "The Shepherd Of The Sheep!"
          - And His Sheep Will Follow Him!
  - Let's Read These Verses Together:
    - 10:1-6 "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that entereth not by the door into the sheepfold, but climbeth up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber. / But he that entereth in by the door is the shepherd of the sheep. / To him the porter openeth; and the sheep hear his voice: and he calleth his own sheep by name, and leadeth them out. / And when he putteth forth his own sheep, he goeth before them, and the sheep follow him: for they know his voice. / And a stranger will they not follow, but will flee from him: for they know not the voice of strangers. / This parable spake Jesus unto them: but they understood not what things they were which he spake unto them!"
- 6. Now Even Though Jesus Is Going To:
  - Expand On This Illustration:
    - In The Following Verses:
      - He Begins By Using A Phrase That Should, By Now, Be Familiar To Us:
        - In The Gospel Of John!
  - "Verily, Verily, I Say Unto You!"
    - This Is The 15th Time Out Of 25 Times:
      - It Is Used:
        - In All Of John!
    - And As We've Pointed Out Each Time Before:
      - Jesus Uses This Phrase To Introduce:
        - A Special Truth!
    - A Truth That Is Certain!
      - "Verily" / "Truly" / "Amen" / Twice!
    - A Truth That Is Changeless!
      - Because Truth Is Not Relative! Truth Is Timeless!
    - A Truth That Is Consequential!
      - And Absolutely Vital To Listen To And Learn From!
- 7. And Jesus Reveals This Truth:
  - Directly To The Pharisees:
    - Who Had Just Asked Jesus Back In 9:40:
      - "Are We Blind Also?"
  - And In Effect:
    - Jesus Tells Them:
      - Not Only Are You:
        - Blind To The Truth!
      - You Are Also:
        - Deaf To The Truth!
    - Because You Are Not:
      - One Of My Sheep!
  - And This Was One Of The Main Differences:
    - Between Them And:
      - The Man Born Blind!
        - And So Starting In 10:1 Jesus Describes:

## 1. The Contrast Between The Shepherd:

- And A Thief!
  - Again 10:1-2 "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that entereth not by the door into the sheepfold, but climbeth up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber. / But he that entereth in by the door is the sheepherd of the sheep!"
- Now In 10:6 John Tells Us That:
  - This Is A "Parable" Or Another Way To Put It:

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- A "Figure Of Speech" - Or Even:
                         - An "Object Lesson!"
        - This Means That Parts Of His Story Will Carry A Deeper, Spiritual Meaning Than What's On The
        Surface!
                - However - Not Every Part Of The Story Will Have That Kind Of Meaning!
                         - Sometimes - A Detail Is Given That Just Supports The Story & Moves It Along:
                                  - With No Further Significance Or Symbolism!
        - Well - Its Clear That Some Of The Parts:
                - That Are Significant Include:
                         - The Door!
                         - The Sheenfold!
                         - The Thief!
                         - The Shepherd! And:
                         - The Sheep!
                - In Fact - All Of These:
                         - Are Explained Further By Jesus:
                                  - In The Rest Of Chapter 10!
        - But - Each Of These Parts:
                - Were Also Very Familiar:
                         - To The Audience Jesus Was Speaking To!
                - An Audience That:
                         - Knew About & Used Sheep:
                                  - In So Many Ways!
                                          - For Food!
                                          - For Clothing!
                                          - For Worship!
        - And - A Public "Sheepfold" Would Have Been:
                - A Familiar Sight:
                         - Around Jerusalem!
                - A Large, Open-Air Pen:
                         - With Walls Made Up Of Rocks & Stones:
                                  - Usually Topped Off With Thorns And Briers:
                                          - To Keep Animals & Thieves Out!
                - At A Narrow Opening In The Wall:
                         - A Single Gate Was Placed:
                                  - So That It Could Be Guarded By:
                                          - A "Porter" - Who Would Know The Shepherds!
        - And So - With This In Mind:
                - Jesus Tells The Pharisees About:
- The Difference In Coming:
        - Between The Shepherd & A Thief!
        - The Shepherd - 10:2 - Would Enter:
                - "By The Door!"
                         - That Is - The Right Way!
                - The Door Was The Way:
                         - Planned By The Shepherds:
                                  - To Approach & To Provide For The Needs Of Their Sheep!
        - However - The Thief - 10:1 - Was Entering:
                - "Not By The Door!"
                         - "But Is Climbing Up Some Other Way!"
                                  - Likely - As Far From The Gate & The Porter As Possible:
                                          - So As Not To Be Seen!
                - Later - In 10:10 - Jesus Gives The Reason Why!
                         - "The Thief Cometh Not, But For To Steal, And To Kill, And To Destroy!"
        - And - The Scene Jesus Presents To Us Here:
                - Is A Lively Scene!
                         - Its As If Its Taking Place:
                                  - In Real Time!
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- The Thief Is Already In The Process:
                          - Of Climbing Over The Wall:
                                  - To Steal As Many Sheep:
                                           - As He Can!
        - And That Is Why - Jesus Further Tells Us About:
- The Difference In Character:
        - Between The Shepherd & The Thief!
        - The Shepherd:
                 - Wants The Best For His Sheep!
                         - Because, They Belong To Him!
                 - And So - As He Hears About The Thief:
                         - He Goes To Get His Flock:
                                  - Out Of Danger! But:
        - The Thief:
                 - Cares Nothing For The Sheep:
                         - But Only For Himself!
                 - And So - He Does Not Even Consider:
                         - The Anxiety & Fear & Pain:
                                  - That Those Living Creatures:
                                           - Might Experience!
                          - IE: In Scotland - Sheep Everywhere - Missionary Told Me About A Law - Against -
                         "Worrying" The Sheep!
                 - But - The Thief Doesn't Care!
                         - The Thief - Is Really:
                                  - A Thug!
        - Jesus Describes Him As Both:
                 - A "Thief And A Robber!"
                         - Whereas A Thief:
                                  - Would Steal In Secret!
                          - A Robber:
                                  - Would Do So Openly And Violently!
- And So - The Contrast:
        - Between The Shepherd & The Thief:
                 - Is Great! Like - Night & Day!
                          - And - The Point Is That:
                                  - Only The Shepherd Belongs In The Sheepfold!
        - And - As Jesus Will Go On To Explain:
                 - Not Only Is He The Shepherd In The Story:
                          - He Is Also The Door:
                                  - Through Which His Sheep Might Find Safety & Refuge:
                                           - From Their Enemies!
        - So - The Sheepfold Describes A Place:
                 - Where Many Shepherds:
                          - Would Keep Their Flocks!
                 - Most Likely, It Refers To:
                          - The Nation Of Israel:
                                  - Since - In 10:16 - Jesus Says - "Other Sheep I Have, Which Are Not Of This
                                  Fold!"
                 - But - As We've Seen Throughout John:
                          - Not All Of The:
                                  - "Children Of Israel" Were:
                                           - The Children Of God!
                          - So - Though They Might Have Been:
                                  - Part Of One National Fold:
                                           - They Were Not Part Of Jesus' Flock!
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- Who Had The Right To Go & To Save & To Lead God's True Children & Flock:

- And - As The Shepherd:

- Jesus Was The Only One:

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- Out Of The Place Of Danger & Deception & Distress!
                - And - As The Door:
                         - He Came To Them:
                                 - Through A Message Of "Grace And Truth!" (Gospel!)
        - But - The Thieves:
                - Were Those Who Used:
                         - Other Ways & Means:
                                 - To Get At God's People!
                - Not To Serve Them:
                         - But To Consume Them!
                                 - Much Like The Pharisees Did!
- We Need To Remember:
        - The Great Contrast Between:
                - The True Shepherd Of God's Flock:
                         - And Everyone Else:
                                 - Who Does Not Approach Us:
                                          - Through The Door Of Christ And His Gospel!
        - And Since - Jesus Came To Us:
                - As The True Shepherd Of His Sheep:
                         - We Ought To Follow Him!
                                 - Especially When We Learn More About:
The Care Of The Shepherd:
- For His Sheep!
        - And We Find This In:
                - 10:3-4a - "To him the porter openeth; and the sheep hear his voice: and he calleth his own sheep
                by name, and leadeth them out. / And when he putteth forth his own sheep, he goeth before them!"
                         - What Care & Concern We Find:
                                 - By This Shepherd:
                                          - For His Sheep!
        - Because - Even As:
                - The Thief Is "Climbing Up Some Other Way!"
                         - We See That This Shepherd Is Already:
- Coming For His Sheep!
        - He Comes Right Up To The Gate - And:
                - Right Up To The Porter:
                         - So That He Might Let Him In:
                                 - To Retrieve His Sheep!
        - Now - Even Though:
                - The Shepherd Was Absent From His Sheep:
                         - For A Time - It Does Not Mean That:
                                 - He Did Not Care:
                                          - For Them!
        - He Left Them In The Care Of:
                - The Porter - Or - "Gate-Keeper!"
                         - Who Knew Both:
                                 - The Shepherd & The Sheep!
                         - And "Opened" The Door To Bring Them Both Together!
        - So Far - The Sheep Themselves:
                - Know Nothing About What's Going On:
                         - With The Thief Coming For Them!
                                 - "To Steal, And To Kill, And To Destroy!"
        - But - When The Porter Opens The Door:
                - Help Has Arrived!
                         - Through The Shepherd Himself!
                - This Porter:
                         - May Represent The Ministry Of The Holy Spirit - Who:
                                 - "Opens The Everlasting Doors Of The Hearts Of Men . . . And Lets Him In
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Unto Them!" (Gill)
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- If Jesus Cared Enough:
  - To Come For You:
    - Won't You Follow Him:
      - As Your Shepherd?
  - We Can Also See From 10:3:
    - The Shepherd's:
- Calming Of His Sheep!
  - Because There We Are Told That:
    - "The Sheep Hear His Voice!"
      - So Far His Voice Is Not Directed:
        - To The Sheep But Perhaps:
          - To The Porter Or To Others Nearby!
    - But When They Heard His Voice:
      - The Sheep Recognized His Voice:
        - And Would Have Experienced A "Peace That Passeth All Understanding!"
  - Isn't This What Happens:
    - When You Are Given The Ears You Need To Hear:
      - The Good News Of The Gospel?
        - The Holy Spirit Opens The Door So That Jesus Himself Might Speak To You With His Voice!
    - A "Voice Of Love, Grace, And Mercy! Which Proclaims Peace, Pardon, Liberty, Life, Righteousness, And Salvation; And Which Is A Soul-Quickening, Alluring, Delighting, Refreshing, And Comforting Voice!" (John Gill)
  - If Jesus Cared & Cares Enough:
    - To Calm You:
      - Through The Voice Of His Word:
        - Won't You Follow Him:
          - As Your Shepherd?
  - We Can Also See From 10:3:
    - The Shepherd's:
- Calling To His Sheep!
  - 10:3 "And He Calleth His Own Sheep By Name!"
    - **IE:** Even Today In Some Parts Of The Middle East Shepherds Can Call Their Sheep By Name Or By Signal! And They Will Come One-By-One!
      - And The Shepherd In Jesus' Story Does The Same Thing Because He Knows The Danger "His Own Sheep" Are In!
  - He Calls Out With Persistence!
    - He Keeps On Calling His Sheep:
      - So That Not A Single One Is Lost!
    - And He Will Keep On Calling His Sheep:
      - Until The Last One:
        - Is Safely Gathered To His Side!
  - He Calls Out With Purpose!
    - He Calls For "His Own" Sheep! (2x 10:3 & 4)
      - This Indicates That There Were Other Sheep In The Fold:
        - Who Belonged To Another Shepherd Or To No Shepherd At All!
    - But What Happened To Their Shepherd?
      - Did *He* Care For Them?
      - Did *He* Come To Them?
      - Did He Call Out To Them?
      - Or Did He Just Abandon Them:
        - To The Whims Of The Thieves And Robbers Of This World?
      - But This Shepherd:
        - Did Care! So:
  - He Calls Out With Power!
    - And With Just The Sound Of His Voice:
      - He Brings Each One Of His Sheep:

- To His Side!
- This Is What Jesus Does:
  - For All Of His Sheep!
    - "He Calleth His Own Sheep By Name!"
  - What God Said About Israel:
    - In Isaiah 40:31 He Says To You:
      - "But now thus saith the LORD that created thee, and he that formed thee, Fear not: for I have redeemed thee, I have called thee by thy name; thou art mine!"
  - And If Jesus Cared Enough:
    - To Call You In This Way:
      - Won't You Follow Him:
        - As Your Shepherd?
- We Can Also See From 10:3:
  - The Shepherd's:
- Conducting Of His Sheep!
  - Because 10:3 He "Leadeth Them Out!"
    - But Where? In This Part Of His Story:
      - The Shepherd Leads His Sheep:
        - Out Of The Fold!
  - Now Even Though The Fold:
    - May Have Seemed To The Sheep:
      - To Be The Safest Place In All The World To Be!
        - We Can See That:
    - The Only Safe Place:
      - For The Sheep To Be In The World:
        - Was With Their Shepherd!
  - Because The Sheep-Fold Became:
    - A Place Of Danger & Deception & Distress!
      - But The Side Of The Shepherd:
        - Was A Place Of Love & Joy & Peace!
- And Once The Shepherd:
  - Gets All Of His Sheep Out Of The Fold:
    - How Does He Lead & Conduct Them?
      - 10:4 "And When He Putteth Forth His Own Sheep, He Goeth Before Them!"
  - IE: This Is Different Than How Sheep Are Herded In Western Countries! Even Here They Are "Driven"
  - Often Using Dogs! But Back Then & There The Shepherd Would "Lead" His Sheep By "Going Before Them!"
    - And This Too Is How Jesus Leads & Conducts His Sheep!
      - Not By Driving Them!
        - From The Rear!
      - But Guiding Them!
        - From The Front!
      - Nothing Will Meet His Sheep:
        - Without Meeting Him First!
  - All That We Find In:
    - The Shepherd Psalm Psalm 23:
      - Is True Of This Shepherd!
        - Our Lord Jesus Christ!
    - "The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. / He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. / He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. / Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. / Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. / Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the LORD for ever!"
- If Jesus Cared Enough:
  - To Come For You!
  - To Calm You!

- To Call You! And:
- To Conduct You!
  - Won't You Follow Him:
    - Day-By-Day As Your Shepherd?
      - Listen To His Voice:
        - Through His Word!
      - Respond To His Voice:
        - Through Obedience To His Word!
- And This Will Be True For You:
  - If You Are In-Fact One Of His Sheep:
    - Because Of:

## 3. The Confidence In The Shepherd:

- By His Sheep That We Find In:
  - 10:4b-5 "And the sheep follow him: for they know his voice. / And a stranger will they not follow, but will flee from him: for they know not the voice of strangers!"
    - Here Jesus Reminds The Pharisees That:
- The Sheep Will Follow:
  - Their Shepherd!
    - This Was Such A Common-Place Truth:
      - That It Probably Seemed Unnecessary For Him To Even Say!
    - But Through This Illustration:
      - Jesus Explained:
        - Why & How The Man Born Blind Came To See & Believe In Jesus!
          - It Was Because He Was One Of His Sheep!
  - And He Followed Jesus:
    - By *Turning To* Jesus:
      - And By Tuning In:
        - To His Voice!
    - Again 10:4b:
      - "The Sheep Follow Him: For / Because They Know His Voice!"
  - And Now It Didn't Matter:
    - Where Jesus, As The Shepherd Of That Man's Soul, Would Lead Him!
      - Even If It Was:
        - Out Of The "Fold" That:
          - He Had Grown Up In & Knew So Well! And:
      - Even If It Was:
        - Into The "Field" Of A World:
          - That Seemed To Strange & Foreign & Dangerous To Him!
  - He Would Follow Jesus:
    - Because He Trusted In Jesus!
      - And So Can You!
        - Trust Him!
        - Turn To Him!
        - And Keep Tuning In To Him!
      - Because He Will Keep Speaking To You:
        - With The Same Voice:
          - That He Called You By!
        - A Voice Full:
          - Of Grace & Truth!
    - But Then Jesus Adds In 10:5 That:
- The Sheep Will Flee:
  - From Strangers!
    - Again A Common-Place Truth!
      - But One That Should Encourage:
        - God's Flock! Because:
  - 10:5 "A Stranger Will They Not Follow, But Will Flee From Him: For / Because They Know Not The Voice Of Strangers!"

- - Because As We Are Told In Isaiah 40:11 "He shall feed his flock like a shepherd: he shall gather the lambs with his arm, and carry them in his bosom, and shall gently lead those that are with young!"
- So If You Have Heard:
  - The Call Of Jesus As Your Shepherd:
    - To Believe In Him:
      - Then Be Confident In Him!
        - And Trust Him!
      - And Keep:
        - Turning To Him & Tuning In To His Voice:
          - As You Follow Him!

### **Conclusion:**

- 1. And Yet What Does John Tell Us Happened:
  - Right After Jesus:
    - Spoke This Parable / Illustration Unto Them?
      - 10:6 "But They Understood Not What Things They Were Which He Spake Unto Them!"
  - And This Response:
    - Proved The Very Point Jesus Was Making:
      - Through His Story!
    - So Even Though:
      - They Heard Jesus' Words:
        - They Did Not *Understand* His Words:
          - Because They Were Not:
            - "The Sheep Of His Pasture!" (Psalm 100:3)

- 2. In Other Words:
  - They Were As Spiritually Deaf:
    - To The Words Of Jesus:
      - As They Were Spiritually *Blind*:
        - To His Works!
  - Yet How They Needed:
    - To Hear & Understand Jesus' Words!
      - Because It Was The Most:
        - Certain & Consequential Truth:
          - They Would Ever Hear!
- 3. But If You Have Been:
  - Given Ears To Hear This Truth:
    - Even Like The Man Born Blind:
      - What Are You Doing With This Truth?
  - Remember:
    - This Is Why:
      - Jesus Came To You:
        - Through The Door Of The Gospel!
    - This Is Why:
      - Jesus Calmed You:

- As The Holy Spirit Brought:
  - Light & Life Into Your Heart!
- This Is Why:
  - Jesus Called Out To You:
    - With His Own Voice:
      - By Name! And:
- This Is Why:
  - Jesus Is Now Conducting & Guiding You:
    - Through The Wilderness Of This World!
- According To:
  - 10:4 "He Goeth Before Them, And The Sheep Follow Him!"
    - He Goes Before You:
      - So That You Might:
        - Follow Him!
- 4. Are You Following Jesus:
  - The Way These Sheep Follow Their Shepherd?
    - Fully & Completely & Without Reservation?
      - What Is Holding You Back?
      - What Strange Voice Is Distracting You?
      - What Sins Are Deterring You?
      - What Struggles Are Discouraging You?
  - "The Sheep Follow Him!"
    - So Follow Jesus As Your Shepherd:
      - With All Of Your Heart!

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
