Sermon Outline for Sunday, March 14, 2021

Sermon: "A Rock That Can Not Be Moved." Grateful to be Depressed! Pt. 3

**I Text:**

Old Covenant: *Jeremiah 15*

New Covenant: *2 Corinthians 11*

**II Doctrine:**

God's people must learn to stand firm for the gospel in the midst of a wicked generation. Just like in Jeremiah and Paul's day, the "Elites" within the visual church are Satan's prostitutes. There is no doctrine of demons they will not fornicate with to promote their books, conferences, retreats, and other money making schemes. They appear to be minister's of light but are servants of Satan.

Were Jeremiah and Paul wrong for having intermittent bouts of depression? Should they have run to a doctor for medication? The most challenging part of a prophet's life is to have your people hate you for telling the truth. Jeremiah was known as the "weeping" Prophet because he had a heart, and had to witness the destruction of his own people. The Apostle Paul was the Jeremiah of the New Testament witnessing to Judah before it's eventual destruction in 69 A.D. Those times have come upon us again in the Christian West.

God can deliver his people from the wrath he will pour out on mystery Babylon. We must begin now separating form the "World System" spiritually, emotionally, and covenant with people who love God.

**III Comparing Scripture With Scripture:**

Jeremiah was known as the "weeping" Prophet because he had a heart, and had to witness the destruction of his own people. The Apostle Paul was the Jeremiah of the New Testament witnessing to Judah before it's eventual destruction in 69 A.D. Those times have come upon us again in the Christian West. (*Jeremiah 15:10-18; 2 Corinthians 11:16-33*)

3) God can deliver his people from the wrath he will pour out on mystery Babylon. We must begin now separating form the "World System" spiritually, emotionally, and covenant with people who love God. (*1 Kings 19:1-10*)
