



God Speaks through His Word

Matthew 27:11-26

¹¹Now Jesus stood before the governor, and the governor asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus said, "You have said so." ¹²But when he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he gave no answer. ¹³Then Pilate said to him, "Do you not hear how many things they testify against you?" ¹⁴But he gave him no answer, not even to a single charge, so that the governor was greatly amazed.

¹⁵Now at the feast the governor was accustomed to release for the crowd any one prisoner whom they wanted. ¹⁶And they had then a notorious prisoner called Barabbas. ¹⁷So when they had gathered, Pilate said to them, "Whom do you want me to release for you: Barabbas, or Jesus who is called Christ?" ¹⁸For he knew that it was out of envy that they had delivered him up. ¹⁹Besides, while he was sitting on the judgment seat, his wife sent word to him, "Have nothing to do with that righteous man, for I have suffered much because of him today in a dream." ²⁰Now the chief priests and the elders persuaded the crowd to ask for Barabbas and destroy Jesus. ²¹The governor again said to them, "Which of the two do you want me to release for you?" And they said, "Barabbas." ²²Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" They all said, "Let him be crucified!" ²³And he said, "Why? What evil has he done?" But they shouted all the more, "Let him be crucified!"

²⁴So when Pilate saw that he was gaining nothing, but rather that a riot was beginning, he took water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this man's blood; see to it yourselves." ²⁵And all the people answered, "His blood be on us and on our children!" ²⁶Then he released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, delivered him to be crucified.

Acts 4:23-31

²³When they were released, they went to their friends and reported what the chief priests and the elders had said to them. ²⁴And when they heard it, they lifted their voices together to God and said, "Sovereign Lord, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and everything in them, ²⁵who through the mouth of our father David, your servant, said by the Holy Spirit,

"Why did the Gentiles rage, and the peoples plot in vain? ²⁶The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers were gathered together, against the Lord and against his Anointed'--

²⁷for truly in this city there were gathered together against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel, ²⁸to do whatever your hand and your plan had predestined to take place. ²⁹And now, Lord, look upon their threats and grant to your servants to continue to speak your word with all boldness, ³⁰while you stretch out your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are performed through the name of your holy servant Jesus." ³¹And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness.

Cornerstone has joined Care Portal! "Connected by Technology, Powered by People, Led by God"

Care Portal is an international organization which helps church members make connections with children and families in crisis via the Social Services agencies. A major goal is to keep biological families intact.

At this point, in Rochester, it operates only at the first tier level, which is helping with physical needs.

How it works:

After a child welfare worker has visited a family in crisis and identified a physical need, the worker sends a request to Care Portal, which then emails basic information to the enrolled churches via the "point person."

If the point person discerns that the need can be meets our criteria, the request is accepted and the details are made known to members who are "on the team." In our case, our deacons will be supporting the cost of this assistance within predetermined guidelines. As we want to reach out to our church neighborhood, we are limiting our assistance to the 14616 zip code.

Examples of requests:

-Gift cards for clothing stores so a child in foster care can dress appropriately for school.

-Baby mattress

-Used furniture to enable a family to move into a home and receive their children back from foster care.

What can you do?

-Join the team! (Charlotte Giebel has been designated the "point person" but she needs others who can help with the purchases and deliveries.)

-Purchase the needed products if applicable and receive reimbursement from the deacons.

-Take the help to the family. Personal delivery of the needed items requires volunteers who would like to offer this help in the name of the Lord and our church. We are preparing leaflets to introduce the church and welcome the family's participation.

-Pray for this effort on the part of about twenty Rochester churches that we would be representing the hands and feet of Jesus as we reach out to needy families.
