Introduction:
Dispensation #5: The Age of the Mosaic Law (Exodus 19:1 – Acts 1:26)
The nation of Israel, through Moses, was given the Mosaic Law. It consisted of 613 commandments covering all phases of life and activity. It revealed in specific detail God's in that economy. The people were responsible to keep the law, but they failed. As a result, there were many judgements given throughout this long period.
Some helpful distinctions between Law and Grace: - The Law says, "Do" whereas grace says, "Believe".
- Under Law, holiness is required but no power is given to live a holy life. Under Grace, holiness is taught, and the necessary power is given.
- The Law is a system of bondage (Galatians 4:1-3); Grace is a system of liberty (Galatians 5:1). People under the Law are servants; people under grace are sons and daughters.
- The Law is something to be kept. Grace is something that keeps.
Conclusion:

To impose the Law upon Christians as a rule of life has grave spiritual and moral dangers; and it moves ultimately in the direction of doctrinal disaster, bringing confusion.
