# **How Are We to Handle Contentious Siblings?**

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2. How Do We Rightly Understand Embittered Christians?

3. Rejoice in Christ's Name Being Made Glorious!

CONCLUSION: Sometimes it is more difficult to forgive family members for the wounds they inflict than it is to forgive our enemies. Paul shows us how trust in Christ frees us from getting embittered by jealousy and envy. We can rejoice in the progress of the gospel despite hardships because God is faithfully using what look like setbacks to us for the spread of His glory. Let us with Paul rejoice!

#### **Romans 12:1-5**

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. <sup>2</sup> Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

<sup>3</sup> For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you *not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think*, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. <sup>4</sup> For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, <sup>5</sup> so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another.

## First Peter 1:3-9

<sup>3</sup> Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, <sup>4</sup> to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, <sup>5</sup> who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. <sup>6</sup> In this you *rejoice*, though now for a little while, if necessary, *you have been grieved by various trials*, <sup>7</sup> so that the tested genuineness of your faith—more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire—may be found *to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ*. <sup>8</sup> Though you have not seen him, you love him. Though you do not now see him, you believe in him and *rejoice with joy that is inexpressible* and filled with glory, <sup>9</sup> obtaining the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

## **Deuteronomy 12:7**

And there you shall eat before the Lord your God, and *you shall rejoice*, you and your households, in all that you undertake, in which the Lord your God has blessed you.

# **Taking Gathered Worship Home**

God calls us to love our enemies, to turn the other cheek to those who strike us, and in this week's passage, to rejoice in Christ's name being proclaimed even when it is done out of envy and in a way that is designed to cause us hardship. What?! Isn't this too much? Only if it was too much for Him to love us while we still despised Him. He calls us into this fellowship not to make us miserable, but to know true joy.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

#### **Sunday Morning**

READ Philippians 1:15-18; Romans 12:1-5; First Peter 1:3-9; Luke 15:1, 11-32; Deuteronomy 12:1-28; Ecclesiastes 3:12-13. DISCUSS How is Paul able to rejoice in people seeking to harm him? What about our partnership together in Christ should change how we respond to this type of envy? What is the hardest part of forgiving others for you? PRAY "Lord Christ, help us to want Your name glorified above everything else. Teach us to trust You in all things."

#### Monday

READ **Philippians** 1:15-18; **Romans** 12:1-5; 14-21. DISCUSS How does trust in Christ's sovereignty free us to forgive others? Who do you have a hard time accepting as a brother/sister in Christ? How can you trust Christ's work in them? MEDITATE on **Luke** 15:32. PRAY, "Lord Jesus, *teach us to trust You* in all Your ways. You are faithful to complete Your household exactly as You planned."

#### **Tuesday**

READ Philippians 1:15-18; First Peter 1:3-9; Luke 15:1, 11-32. DISCUSS How does rejoicing in trials demonstrate faith in Christ? Why is this important? MEDITATE on Luke 15:32. PRAY, "Lord, help us to delight in being Your people. Teach us to proclaim Your glory to whomever You send us."

#### Wednesday

READ **Philippians 1:15-18**; **Luke 15:1-32**. DISCUSS, Why was it proper for Jesus to feast with sinners? Why was celebration necessary? How does this apply to believers in your life? Why is this so difficult for us? MEDITATE on **Luke 15:32**. PRAY, "Lord, use us as You will and teach us to rejoice in You."

#### **Thursday**

READ Philippians 1:15-18; Deuteronomy 12:1-28; First Corinthians 12:27-31. DISCUSS, What is repeated that they should do in terms of rejoicing? Why? How is rejoicing in the Lord central to living out the gospel? MEDITATE on Luke 15:32. PRAY, Lord, You are more than enough for us. Teach us to be satisfied in You."

#### **Friday**

READ Philippians 1:15-18; Romans 12:1-5; First Peter 1:3-9; Luke 15:1, 11-32; Deuteronomy 12:1-28; Ecclesiastes 3:12-13. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? DELIGHT in Christ with all your heart and love His people with joy! MEDITATE on Luke 15:32. PRAY for unity and joyful care for one another at FCCW.

#### Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow which is *available both in-person and via live-stream*. READ **Philippians 1:1-30**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the service. Ask Jesus to gather us together joyfully to praise Him.
