

## “DISTINGUISHING THE HELLS OF THE BIBLE”

### #1. \_\_\_\_\_

a. Its DESIGNATION.

- 1) “Sheol” is the Hebrew word for the \_\_\_\_\_ of the earth, and can refer to the \_\_\_\_\_ or the place of \_\_\_\_\_. (Habakkuk 2:4-5; Jonah 2:2)

b. Its DESCRIPTION and DESTINY.

- 1) Sheol/Hades consisted of two compartments: \_\_\_\_\_ for the unsaved and \_\_\_\_\_ for the saved. (Luke 16:23; 23:43) Paradise is now in the \_\_\_\_\_. (2 Corinthians 12:2-4)

b. Its DESCRIPTION and DESTINY.

- 1) "Gehenna" was an actual \_\_\_\_\_ in the valley of \_\_\_\_\_ southeast of Jerusalem (Josh. 15:8) where children were sacrificed to Moloch (2 Chron. 33:1-6; Jer. 7:31), and was later used to dispose of garbage and dead bodies.
- 2) Jesus Christ repeatedly utilized the word "Gehenna" to designate a place of \_\_\_\_\_ for the lost.
- 3) "Gehenna" is synonymous with the \_\_\_\_\_.

b. Its DESCRIPTION.
