## Call to Worship

This call puts before us the most powerful stimulus to worship: the juxtaposition of the facts that God is both our King and our Shepherd.

#### Psalm 95:1-7b ESV

- Oh come, let us sing to the LORD; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!
- <sup>2</sup> Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!
- <sup>3</sup> For the LORD is a great God, and a great King above all gods.
- <sup>4</sup> In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also.
- <sup>5</sup> The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands formed the dry land.
- Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the LORD, our Maker!
- For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.

In this event God demonstrates His demand that His people recognize and respect His glory and holiness, something that is a vital part of what the Tabernacle itself teaches.

#### Leviticus 10:1-3 ESV

Now Nadab and Abihu, the sons of Aaron, each took his censer and put fire in it and laid incense on it and offered unauthorized fire before the LORD, which he had not commanded them. <sup>2</sup> And fire came out from before the LORD and consumed them, and they died before the LORD. <sup>3</sup> Then Moses said to Aaron, "This is what the LORD has said: 'Among those who are near me I will be sanctified, and before all the people I will be glorified." And Aaron held his peace.

## Assurance of Pardoning Grace

Our salvation is dependent in part upon the fact that Jesus Christ has not only risen from the dead, but also ascended to the throne of God, from where He pours out the Spirit to apply salvation to all of His people.

#### Acts 2:29-39 ESV

"Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. <sup>30</sup> Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants on his throne, <sup>31</sup> he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. <sup>32</sup> This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. <sup>33</sup> Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, he has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing. <sup>34</sup> For David did not ascend into the heavens, but he himself says,

"The Lord said to my Lord,

"Sit at my right hand,

35 until I make your enemies your footstool."

<sup>36</sup> Let all the house of Israel therefore know for certain that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified."

<sup>37</sup> Now when they heard this they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" <sup>38</sup> And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. <sup>39</sup> For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself."

Leader: This is the gospel. Congregation: Hallelujah!

#### \* Hymn of Assurance

Notice that this hymn is both a confession of our sinfulness and an expression of faith in the cross of Christ as our only hope.

# The Apostles' Creed

#### Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer and encourage wine for those who take part in Communion. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.
