II. GOD'S FUTURE RESTORATION OF ISRAEL: GOD UPDATES THE FUTURE TO EZEKIEL AS HE PREPARES FOR THE COMING OF HIS SON, MESSIAH EZEK. 36

III. GOD'S MIRACULOUS RESTORATION OF ISRAEL FROM THEIR GRAVES!

- A. Prophecies often have dual fulfillments an earlier and a later, final one.
 - 1. In the earlier one, an element of the prophecy was not fully complete; it is a type, example
 - 2. When a prophecy is not fully completed, the second and final one will be exact.
 - 3. This occurs because humans repeat their actions with almost predictable results and God responds with actions to keep that history moving in a linear fashion to the destination of the restored Kingdom of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. History is linear but it is traveled by vehicles of a repetitive cyclical progress.
- B. Some prophecies are intentionally only partially fulfilled with the final phase coming at a later date on purpose. We call this "already, not yet."
- C. The prophesy is for the one intended, though others may benefit from its fulfillment
- D. The prophecy of the valley of dry bones is

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specifically about Israel with whom God has an unchangeable relationship Jer 31:35-37; Eze 37:11

- 1. This prophecy is about the restoration of a dead Israel with no hope, broken up, dried out; it is for these children of Israel who know it will take a miracle for them to return to their own land, reunited after many years separated from one another.
- 2. The miracle is completely the work of God using the agency of the prophet to make it happen. Dry bones coming together, coming to life; the necessity of the Spirit of God; Another lesson in the ways of God! 37:1-10
- 3. God's explanation:
 - a. The bones are the whole house of Israel, the 12 tribes united; they believe it is impossible
 - b. God Himself will take them out of their graves; two-fold meaning—literal graves as in resurrection of all OT saints; returned from the "graves" of the nations in which they live

c. Why? That you will know I am the LORD

E. The two sticks become one: Judah and Joseph

- 1. God gathers them from the nations and makes them one nation
- 2. They will have one king, David, one shepherd
- 3. Obedience and a new covenant; He lives there with them forever
