Romans 8:28,29 WE KNOW THAT ALL THINGS WORK GOOD

I. What?

- A. "All things" refers to absolutely everything in the life of everyone who is called of God, from conception to death.
 - 1. The seemingly insignificant (every hair Matt. 10:30) to that which we think to be the most important and great.
 - 2. This implies that God sovereignly controls all things in the whole universe (Eph. 1:10,11; Prov. 16:33).
- B. All things "work together," i.e., work cooperatively.
- C. "For good" in God's judgment.
 - 1. The determination of what is good is that which conforms us spiritually "to the image of His Son" (29a).
 - 2. God's goal in everything He does in our lives is to conform us to "His Son," i.e., so we "look" like God's children.
- D. This wonderful purpose of God is not for our sake, but for Jesus' sake (29b).
- II. This work God performs on "them who are the called according to His purpose."
 - A. We are "the called" (cf. 30; 1:6,7).
 - B. We are called "according to His purpose."
- III. This truth is first known and then experienced in the way of our loving God.
 - A. First, this truth is known (not always experienced or felt). "We know:" (3:19; 7:14; 8:22; Il Cor. 5:1; I Tim. 1:8).
 - B. This knowledge is ours in the way of our loving God (the Greek word order puts this at the beginning of the sentence).
 - 1. Our love for God arises (and grows) from His (first) love for us (I John 4:19).
 - 2. Our love takes His Word as truth and trusts Him (especially when we cannot understand).
 - C. Such knowledge, trust and love, is what makes us to be like God's Son.
