Ephesians 5:1–2

<u>Therefore</u>, be imitators of God, as beloved children. ² And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, *a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God*.

Two Main Themes of Numbers 30

- All Vows Should Be Kept without Delay
- A Faithful Head-of-household Could Establish or Oppose the Vows of His Daughters/Wives.

Key Idea #1

Our faithfulness to our word is a grateful response to and reflection of God's faithfulness.

Numbers 23:19 (Balaam)

¹⁹ God is not man, that he should lie, or a son of man, that he should change his mind. *Has he said, and will he not do it?* Or *has he spoken, and will he not fulfill it?*

Key Idea #2

(Faithful Fathers/Daughters & Husbands/Wives)
The authority in a covenant household is also a reflection of God's/Jesus' relationship with himself & his people.

Pursuit of Godliness

Pursing Christ-Likeness...

Hebrews 1:3a

He [Jesus] is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his nature...

Keeping Our Word...Even when it Hurts

² If a man vows a vow to the Lord, or swears an oath to bind himself by a pledge, he shall not break his word. <u>He</u> shall do according to all that proceeds out of his mouth.

Psalm 15:4b

...who swears to his own hurt and does not change... (HCSB) ...who keeps his word whatever the cost...

This is a Picture of the Gospel!

Hebrews 6:17–19 (Cf. Mark 14:36)

the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he guaranteed it with an oath, ¹⁸ so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us. ¹⁹ We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain...

Trustworthiness Rather than Hasty Promises

Why do you usually say, "I promise..."?

Matthew 5:33–37

'You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform to the Lord what you have sworn.' 34 But I say to you, <u>Do not take an oath at all</u>, either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, 35 or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. 36 And do not take an oath by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. 37 <u>Let what you say be simply 'Yes' or 'No'; anything more than this comes from evil.</u>

Vows should not be used to prop up our untrustworthiness, but rather, as a means of honoring God's trustworthiness.

The Godliness of Faithful Covenant Roles

Ephesians 5:22–26 (This is also a Picture of the Gospel!)

Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is the head of the wife even as *Christ is the head of the church*, his body, and is himself its Savior. ²⁴ Now as *the church submits to Christ*, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands. ²⁵ *Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her*, ²⁶ that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word...

Aiming Our Lives at God's Glory

Key Idea

A God-glorifying response to our salvation is to give ourselves to a whole-hearted imitation of Jesus.

Application Points:

- ✓ Tell the truth/keep our word for God's glory not our own (Boast only in Christ)
 - Weep your word given to your neighbor/co-worker etc. especially when it hurts...

Hebrews 12:1b–2

- ...let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, ² looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him <u>endured</u> the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.
 - Avoid hasty promises
 - Tell the truth even on your taxes...
- ✓ Embrace God's assigned gender roles as another opportunity to display God's glory. (Jesus is our best picture of both submission and servant-leadership)

Ephesians 5:15–17

Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, ¹⁶ making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. ¹⁷ Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

- Keep your marriage vows:
 - Embrace submission to your own husband...
 - Embrace your leadership by loving your wife sacrificially...
 - Get help: The Excellent Husband; Other godly couples; pastoral counseling
- Joyfully submit to your eternal Husband...
 - Embrace submission to proper authority....
 - Embrace servant leadership...
