The Christian and Government (part 3) Romans 13:5-7

Opening:

Romans 13:1-7

- Every person is to be in subjection to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those which exist are established by God.
- 2 Therefore whoever resists authority has opposed the ordinance of God; and they who have opposed will receive condemnation upon themselves.
- For rulers are not a cause of fear for good behavior, but for evil. Do you want to have no fear of authority? Do what is good and you will have praise from the same;
- 4 for it is a minister of God to you for good. But if you do what is evil, be afraid; for it does not bear the sword for nothing; for it is a minister of God, an avenger who brings wrath on the one who practices evil.
- 5 Therefore it is necessary to be in subjection, not only because of wrath, but also for conscience' sake.
- 6 For because of this you also pay taxes, for *rulers* are servants of God, devoting themselves to this very thing.
- Render to all what is due them: tax to whom tax *is due*; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honor to whom honor. (Romans 13:1-7)

1. conclusion: we submit to government (v.5)
2. recognition: we pay taxes (v.6)
3. obligation: we submit and respect (v.7)

1. How is the practical teaching of Romans 13:1-7 connected to the book of Romans as a whole? How is our response to government related to the gospel?
2. A Christian friend says that he is willing to submit to government—as long as it's a godly government, since ungodly government is not ordained by God. How would you reply?

3. Fred is a Christian businessman who realizes that abortion is a sin against God since all people are made in God's image. He also realizes that our government funds abortion. Because of this Fred works on a cash basis
