I. Introduction.

- A. Our devotion to God produces a devotion to one another in the church. Rom. 12:1ff
- B. Praise God for His design of the church. Acts 2:47

II. Make a sober assessment of your spiritual gifts. v. 3

- A. What is a spiritual gift?
 - 1. Not merely a natural talent, but a special God-given ability given for ministry.
 - 2. Every believer has at least one spiritual gift. I Co. 12:7 I Pe. 4:10
- B. Don't think too highly of yourself. v. 3a Gal. 6:3
 - 1. Those who are especially gifted can be tempted to pride.
 - 2. Pride robs God of His glory and harms the church body. I Co. 3:3-4 III John 9
 - 3. You have nothing to be proud of because your gift is sovereignly bestowed by God. v. 3c, 6 I Co. 12:6-7,18 4:7 3:5-7 15:10 John 15:5
 - 4. Paul recognizes his apostolic gift is only by God's grace. v. 3a 1:5 15:15 I Ti. 1:12ff
- C. Nor should you think too little of the gifts God has given you. v. 3b I Co. 12:15-16
 - 1. Those who have the less visible gifts may be tempted to denigrate themselves
 - 2. Those who undervalue their gifts tend to underutilize them -- to the detriment of the body.
 - 3. Honor the gifts of others, especially those whose gifts are less flashy. I Co. 12:23
 - 4. God sovereignly distributes gifts according to His purpose. I Co. 12:18 Jo. 3:27ff
 - 5. You are a steward of your gift. Lu. 12:48

III. Understand how your gifts function in the church body. v. 4-5

- A. The body is a powerful metaphor for the church. I Co. 10:17 12:27 Col. 1:24 2:19 3:15 Eph. 1:23 4:4,12,15,16,25
- B. God has made us purposefully diverse.
 - 1. There is a great diversity of grace gifts among God's people as every believer has a unique function in the body.
 - 2. There is even diversity among those who have a particular grace gift.
 - 3. There is also a diversity among local churches in the universal body of Christ.
- C. God has designed our diversity to organically unite and strengthen us. I Co. 12:12-18
 - 1. None of us has all of the gifts.
 - 2. None of us is independent of the others.
 - 3. The body functions as a whole.
 - 4. Your gift is given so that you might edify (build up) the body. <u>I Co. 12:7 14:12</u>
 - 5. Our interdependence reinforces humility.
 - 6. The church is to grow with each member doing his or her part. Eph. 4:11-16
- D. You must be committed to a local church body in order to function properly. Heb. 13:17 I Th. 5:12-13 I Co. 12:12
- E. These truths have implications for how the church is to be run.
 - 1. Not a one man (or a "professional") ministry. We are all priests. I Pet. 2:5
 - 2. Our leaders must encourage the development and use of every member's gifts.
 - 3. Our focus should be on discipleship rather than programs. Mt. 28:18ff II Ti. 2:2

- A. General principles regarding the use of gifts.
 - 1. There is a sense in which each of us is called to build each other up in all of these ways. There is a danger of becoming over-specialized.
 - a. All should give. I Co. 16:1-2 Pr. 3:9-10
 - b. All should serve. Mark 10:45 John 15:1ff
 - c. All should speak the Word to each other to build up the body. <u>Eph. 4:15-16,29</u> 5:19 Col. 3:16 Rom. 15:14 Heb. 5:12 8:11 10:24-25 3:13
 - 2. God has given every believer a gifting which should be a focal point in our service to Him and to the church body. I Tim. 4:14-16 I Pe. 4:10-11
 - 3. Just as God sovereignly gives different kinds of gifts, He also gives different degrees of gifting. v. 3b,6a I Co. 12:6 I Pe. 4:10
 - 4. Spiritual gifts can be developed and improved through faithful use. II Tim. 1:6-7
 - 5. The gift lists in Scripture are exemplary, not exhaustive. I Co. 12:28-30 Eph. 4:11
 - 6. The gifts fall into two broad categories: speaking and serving. I Pe. 4:10-11
 - 7. Each gift has its particular pitfalls.
- B. Revelatory gifts were foundational in the early church. Eph. 2:20
 - 1. Paul was an apostle. v. 3a I Co. 9:1 15:9 II Co. 12:12
 - 2. Some were prophets. v. 6b Eph. 2:20 4:11 I Co. 12:28.10 14:1 Acts 11:27-28 21:9ff
 - a. While there were some gifts in the early church about which we know little, prophecy is clearly defined in Scripture. Dt. 13:1-5 18:15-22 II Pe. 1:20-21
 - b. Prophets served as God's mouthpieces, through whom revealed truth was communicated. Ex. 4:16 7:1
 - c. The standard for one claiming to be a prophet is perfection. Dt. 18:18-22 13:1ff
 - 3. Revelatory gifts ceased when the Scriptural canon was closed and the apostles passed off the scene. Eph. 2:20 Heb. 1:1-3 2:3-4 II Co. 12:12
- C. Some of us have gifts of utterance: teaching and exhortation. v. 7b-8a II Ti. 1:11 2:2 Acts 15:35,31 13:15 14:21-22 4:36 Mt. 28:19-20 Js. 3:1ff I Ti. 4:13 Heb. 10:24-25
- D. Many of you have gifts of helping: serving, giving, leadership/administration, mercy. v. 7a,8b 15:27 I Pet. 4:11b Eph. 4:12 Acts 6:1,4 2:45 4:32ff 24:17 II Co. 5:18 8:2 9:13 II Ti. 4:5,11 I Ti. 1:12 3:8ff I Co. 12:5,28 16:15 15:25-27 Phil. 1:1 I Jo. 3:17-18 I Th. 5 Pr. 14:21,31 22:8 17:22 Mt. 5:7 6:3
- E. How can you know your gift? Desire, need, effectiveness, counsel and confirmation.
- F. Each of the gifts is perfectly exemplified in our Lord Jesus Christ.
 - 1. He is your Prophet. Deut. 18:18-22 Mt. 13:57 21:11
 - 2. He is your Servant. Isa. 52:13 53:11 42:1 49:1-7 Mt. 20:28 Phil. 2:7
 - 3. He is your Preacher. John 13:13
 - 4. He is your Encourager and He sends the Comforter. I John 2:1 John 14:16,26
 - 5. He has given Himself for you. II Co. 8:9
 - 6. He is your Leader/Head. Col. 1:18 2:19
 - 7. He has shown you mercy. 11:30-32 12:1 Mt. 25:31f Lu. 4:18-19
- G. Your gift comes as a result of Christ's victorious work and when you use it, you are a minister of His grace. Eph. 4:7ff
