# "That Blessed Hope" Principles Of Prophecy Part 1

#### Introduction:

Last Sunday: 1. - We Started Looking At: - Some Of The "Keys" That Will: - Help Us "Unlock" What: - The Bible Tells Us: - About The End Times! - Those "Keys" Are: - Special Principles Of Interpretation: - That Are Part Of: - A Special Biblical Discipline: - Known As "Hermeneutics!" 2. Well - Last Week: - We Looked At Just One: - Of Those Principles: - And That Was: - "The Point Of Prophecy!" - If You Recall: - We Learned That: - The Primary Point Of All Biblical Prophecy: - Is To Call God's People: - Into A Closer Walk & Relationship With Him! - And This Would Apply To: - Both Old & New Testament Prophecy! - To Be Sure: - There Are Other Points & Reasons: - For Prophecy As Well! - Like - To Inform As Well As To Warn! - But - It All Takes Place In The Context Of: - Drawing God's People Closer To Himself! 3. To Help Us Understand: - This Primary Point Of Prophecy: - We Looked At Three Questions: - That We Should Ask Ourselves: - About God's Prophets - When We Are Looking More Closely At Their Prophecies! - The First Ouestion Is: - What Did The Prophets Do? - Well - We Learned That They Had A Two-Fold Ministry! - Most Of The Time: - They Were Forth-Telling God's Words To God's People In Terms Of God's Covenant! - And Then - From Time To Time: - They Would Fore-Tell God's Plan & Promises! - And - In Both Cases: - They Were Calling God's People: - Back To The Lord! - The Second Question Is: - What Did The Prophets Know? - Well - We Learned That In May Ways: - Their Knowledge Was Limited! - Limited In Both Scope & Time! - And - The Third Question Is: - What Did The Prophets Mean? Well - There Are: 4.

- What Did The Prophets Mean?

- You See - Most Of The Time:

- Prophecy Was Written:

- In A Way That Would Both Appeal To & Apply To:

- The People To Whom:

- That Prophecy Was Originally Given!

- And So - The First Of These Special:

- Six Principles Of Prophecy Is This:

## 1. The Phrasing Of Prophecy:

- Much Of What I Will Be Sharing:

- In Today's Lesson:

- Is Derived From:

- A Study On "The End Times" Published By:

- The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod.

- And - Even Though:

- Some Of Their Conclusions About The End Times:

- May Be Different Than Our Own:

- It Shows Us That These Basic Principles Of Interpretation Are Used By Bible-

Believers Of All Denominations!

- And So - When It Comes To:

- The Phrasing & The Words:

- Of Prophecy - One Of The Most Important Things To Remember Is That:

- So Much Is Given To Us:

- In *Symbolic* Language!

- And - The Simple Reason For This Is:

- Prophecy Is Different:

- Than The Other Forms / Genres:

- Of Biblical Literature!

- And - One Of The Primary Tools:

- In The Prophet's Rhetorical Toolbox:

- Was Symbolism!

- So - When We Start Reading & Studying Prophecy:

- "The Goal Of The Interpreter Must Be To Seek The One <u>Intended</u> Or <u>Literal</u> Sense Of The Text, And To Do So With The Recognition That God In Some Cases Has Chosen To Convey Meaning Through Symbolism And Figures Of Speech!"

- Now - This Is An Important Principle!

- Because - So Often - When We Say:

- We Take The Bible "Literally" - That Should Not Mean:

- That We Ignore The Common Ways People Communicate - Both

Then & Now!

- For Example:

- If I Say To My Wife:

- "I'm Going To Run To The Store!"

- She Knows That I Am Not "Literally" Going To "Run" My Poor Legs Off To Walmart!

- She Understand That My "Running":

- Is Just A Figure Of Speech:

- To Tell Her That I Am "Going" To The Store - Most Likely:

- In Our Car!

- So - To Take The Bible "Literally":

- Means That We Are Trying To Understand:

- The True Sense Of The Authors Words!

- Some Common Figures Of <u>Speech</u>:

- That We Should Be On The Look-Out For:

- Are These:

- Metaphors Where Two Or More Things Are Compared Using Figurative Or Descriptive Language!
  Isaiah 64:8 "But now, O LORD, thou art our father; we are the clay, and thou our potter; and we all are the work of thy hand!"
- Similes Makes A Comparison Using The Words "Like" Or "As!"

- Ezekiel 1:15-16 - "Now as I beheld the living creatures, behold one wheel upon the earth by the living creatures, with his four faces. / The appearance of the wheels and their work was *like unto* the colour of a beryl: and they four had one likeness: and their appearance and their work was *as it were* a wheel in the middle of a wheel!"

- Here - Ezekiel Is Trying To Describe What He Saw In His Vision - Using The Knowledge, Experience, Vocabulary He Had!

- Metonymy - When One Word Or Phrase Is Substituted For Another With Which It Is Closely Associated! - Mt. Zion Can Be Considered In This Way!

- In The Historical Books:

- Mt. Zion Is The Physical Mountain Upon Which God's Temple Was Built!

- But - In The Prophetical Books:

- Mt. Zion Can Refer To Jesus Christ & Heaven Itself!

- We See This Principle:

- In Hebrews 12:22 - "But ye are come unto mount Sion, and unto the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to an innumerable company of angels!"

- There Are Other Common Figures Of Speech:

- That We Need To Be Aware Of:

- To Properly Understand And Interpret:

- Biblical Prophecy!

- But - Just Be Aware:

- That The Prophets Were People:

- Just Like Us - Communicating God's Truth:

- To People Like Us - Using

Common Language - To Convey Their Message In An Understandable Way!

- So - To Take The Bible & Prophecy "Literally":

- Includes Taking Into Account:

- Common Figures Of Speech!

- Another Principle Of Prophecy Has To Do With:

## 2. The Perspective Of Prophecy:

- This Is Something That We Just Touched On:

- Last Week - And That Is:

- "Biblical Prophecy Often Does Not Picture For Us The Intervening Centuries Which Lie As Valleys Between The High Points Of Salvation History!"

- This Is What Prophetic Fore-Telling:

- Often Looks Like:

#### - Mountain Tops & Valleys:

- With No Knowledge Of How Long Those Valleys Will Last!

- One Key Example:

- Of This Kind Of Perspective:

- Is Found In The Old Testament Prophecy:

- Of Joel - Who Lived & Wrote:

- Between 835 - 796 BC!

- He Was Commissioned By God:

- To Warn His People:

- Of His Impending Judgment - And:

- To Call Them Back!

# - In Joel 1:2 - 2:27:

- His Focus Is On:

- The *Immediate* Future:

- And The Swarm Of Locusts That Will Come Upon Israel:

- As Part Of God's Judgment!

- And - He Calls Them:

- To Repentance!

- 2:13 - And rend your heart, and not your garments, and turn unto the LORD your God: for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness, and repenteth him of the evil!"

#### - But Then - In Joel 2:28-29:

- He Prophecies Something That:

- Is In The *Distant* Future!

- "And it shall come to pass afterward, [that] I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions: / And also upon the servants and upon the handmaids in those days will I pour out my spirit!"

- And The Reason We Know This Does Not Describe Something That Took Place In Joel's Time Is Because Of How The Apostle Peter Uses These Verses - In Acts 2:16-18 - To Describe What Happened On The Day Of Pentecost:

- "But this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel!" (Then Quotes Joel 2:28-29) - But Then - From Joel 2:30 - 3:21:

- Joel Describes Something That Is Even More:

- In The Distant Future - The Second Coming!

- 2:30-31 - "And I will shew wonders in the heavens and in the earth, blood, and fire, and pillars of smoke. / The sun shall be turned into darkness, and the moon into blood, before the great and the terrible day of the LORD come!"

- So - There Are Large Gaps Of Time:

- Between These Three Major "High Points" Of Joel's Prophecy!

- Yet - He Writes As If They Are Going To Happen:

- One Right After Another:

- In Rapid Succession!

- And - This Is Not An:

- Uncommon Situation In Prophecy:

- Both OT & NT!

- This Is Also Known As:

- Prophetic "Fore-<u>Shortening</u>!"

- So - "Events In the Near And Distant Future Are Often Telescoped Into One Picture!" - Another Principle Of Prophecy Has To Do With:

## 3. The Period Of Prophecy:

- This Is Just A Reminder That:

- The Prophecies Were Written:

- During Definite Life-Situations:

- For Both The Prophet & The People!

- And That Is Why:

- We Need To - "Ascertain What The Text Meant In Its Historical Situation!"

- This Principle Of Hermeneutics:

- Is Known As The "Grammatical-*Historical* Approach" To Biblical Interpretation!

- All This Means Is That:

- There Were Certain Ways:

- That *They* Thought & Wrote:

- That Might Be Quite Different:

- Than The Way We Think & Write!

- So - The Culture & The Traditions:

- Of God's People In The Old Testament:

- Will Have Some Bearing On:

- How The Prophets:

- Will Convey God's Message To Them!

- This Can Also Be Described As:

- The "Historical Coloring" Of A Prophecy!

- Because - Most Of The Time - Prophets:

- "Delivered Their Oracles In Terms Which Their Original Hears Could

Understand!"

- This Would Even Be True:

- About The Book Of Revelation!

- The Title Of The Book Simply Means:

# - "To Remove The Veil" - From:

- The Greek Word:

- αποκάλυψις

- And - As John Tells Us In:

- Revelation 1:1 - Jesus Gave Him This "Revelation" - "To shew unto his servants things which must shortly come to pass!"

- Not Just His Servants Now, But Then!

- So - An Important Question Is This:

- How Did They Understand His Words Then?

- Once You Uncover That:

- You Are Well On Your Way To Understand:

- The Proper Meaning Of Those Words Now!
