

## Chapter 16

**16** Now the LORD spoke to Moses after <sup>a</sup>the death of the two sons of Aaron, when they offered *profane fire* before the LORD, and died; <sup>2</sup> and the LORD said to Moses: “Tell Aaron your brother <sup>b</sup>not to come at *just* any time into the Holy Place inside the veil, before the mercy seat which *is* on the ark, lest he die; for <sup>c</sup>I will appear in the cloud above the mercy seat.

### 16:3-5

<sup>1</sup>“Thus Aaron shall <sup>d</sup>come into the Holy Place: <sup>e</sup>with *the blood* of a young bull as a sin offering, and *of* a ram as a burnt offering. <sup>4</sup> He shall put the <sup>f</sup>holy linen tunic and the linen trousers on his body; he shall be girded with a linen sash, and with the linen turban he shall be attired. These *are* holy garments. Therefore <sup>g</sup>he shall wash his body in water, and put them on. <sup>5</sup> And he shall take from the congregation of the children of Israel two kids of the goats as a sin offering, and one ram as a burnt offering. Mentioned first in verse 3 as a bull rather than **two goats**. In both verses, a **ram** (breedable male sheep) is **offered**. In verse 3, the **burnt offering** is for Aaron the High Priest, and in verse 5, it is for the **congregation**. So far, then, on this occasion we have the deaths of five animals.

### 16:6-10

“Aaron shall offer the bull as a sin offering, which *is* for himself, and <sup>1</sup>make atonement for himself and for his house. <sup>7</sup> He shall take the two goats and present them before the LORD *at* the door of the tabernacle of meeting. <sup>8</sup> Then Aaron shall cast lots for the two goats: one lot for the LORD and the other lot a chance “game” of some kind. **for the scapegoat**. Some seem to think this is a type of name for a demon or a location, but **scapegoat**, given the context, is the proper translation. The Hebrew word has a meaning that relates to “goat that goes away.” The 7<sup>th</sup> Day Adventists believe this is a reference to the Devil who must take his share of sin’s responsibility to the Lake of Fire on the last day.<sup>1</sup> Colossians 2:16-17 helps us understand that the Lord would not waste time casting shadows in the Old Testament off of Satan. All shadows find their fulfillment in Christ.

<sup>9</sup> And Aaron shall bring the goat on which the LORD’s lot fell, and offer it *as* a sin offering. <sup>10</sup> But the goat on which the lot fell to be the scapegoat shall be presented alive before the LORD, to make <sup>j</sup>atonement upon it, *and* to let it go as the scapegoat into the wilderness.

<sup>11</sup> “And Aaron shall bring the bull of the sin offering, which is for <sup>k</sup>himself, and make atonement for himself and for his house, and shall kill the bull as the sin offering which *is*

for himself. <sup>12</sup> Then he shall take <sup>l</sup>a censer full of burning coals of fire from the altar before the LORD, with his hands full of <sup>m</sup>sweet incense beaten fine, and bring *it* inside the veil.

<sup>13</sup> <sup>n</sup>And he shall put the incense on the fire before the LORD, that the cloud of incense may cover the <sup>o</sup>mercy seat that *is* on the Testimony, lest he <sup>p</sup>die. <sup>14</sup> <sup>q</sup>He shall take some of the blood of the bull and <sup>r</sup>sprinkle *it* with his finger on the mercy seat on the east *side*; and before the mercy seat he shall sprinkle some of the blood with his finger seven times.

<sup>15</sup> <sup>s</sup>“Then he shall kill the goat of the sin offering, which *is* for the people, bring its blood <sup>t</sup>inside the veil, do with that blood as he did with the blood of the bull, and sprinkle it on the mercy seat and before the mercy seat. <sup>16</sup> So he shall <sup>u</sup>make atonement for the Holy *Place*, because of the uncleanness of the children of Israel, and because of their transgressions, for all their sins; and so he shall do for the tabernacle of meeting which remains among them in the midst of their uncleanness. <sup>17</sup> There shall be <sup>v</sup>no man in the tabernacle of meeting when he goes in to make atonement in the Holy *Place*, until he comes out, that he may make atonement for himself, for his household, and for all the assembly of Israel. <sup>18</sup> And he shall go out to the altar that *is* before the LORD, and make atonement for <sup>w</sup>it, and shall take some of the blood of the bull and some of the blood of the goat, and put it on the horns of the altar all around. <sup>19</sup> Then he shall sprinkle some of the blood on it with his finger seven times, cleanse it, and <sup>x</sup>consecrate <sup>2</sup>it from the <sup>3</sup>uncleanness of the children of Israel.

<sup>20</sup> “And when he has made an end of atoning for the Holy *Place*, the tabernacle of meeting, and the altar, he shall bring the live goat. <sup>21</sup> Aaron shall lay both his hands on the head of the live goat, <sup>y</sup>confess over it all the iniquities of the children of Israel, and all their transgressions, concerning all their sins, <sup>z</sup>putting them on the head of the goat, and shall send *it* away into the wilderness by the hand of a suitable man. <sup>22</sup> The goat shall bear on itself all their iniquities to an uninhabited land; and he shall release the goat in the wilderness. And you better believe the goat is not coming back on his own. So this goat will take the **iniquities** away while the other goat died for the **iniquities**. Christ fulfills both [He carried our sins away (John 1:29) and died for them (1 Corinthians 15:1-3)].<sup>2</sup> The SDA’s, however, believe one goat is Christ while the other is Satan.

<sup>23</sup> “Then Aaron shall come into the tabernacle of meeting, <sup>c</sup>shall take off the linen garments which he put on when he went into the Holy *Place*, and shall leave them there.

<sup>24</sup> And he shall wash his body with water in a holy place, put on his garments, come out and offer his burnt offering and the burnt offering of the people, and make <sup>6</sup>atonement for himself and for the people. <sup>25</sup> <sup>d</sup>The fat of the sin offering he shall burn on the altar. <sup>26</sup> And he who released the goat as the scapegoat shall wash his clothes <sup>e</sup>and bathe his body in water, and afterward he may come into the camp. <sup>27</sup> <sup>f</sup>The bull *for* the sin offering and the goat *for* the sin offering, whose blood was brought in to make atonement in the Holy Place, shall be carried outside the camp. And they shall burn in the fire their skins, their flesh, and their offal. <sup>28</sup> Then he who burns them shall wash his clothes and bathe his body in water, and afterward he may come into the camp.

<sup>29</sup> “*This shall be a statute forever for you: <sup>g</sup>In the seventh month, on the tenth day of the month, you shall <sup>7</sup>afflict your souls, and do no work at all, whether a native of your own country or a stranger who <sup>8</sup>dwells among you. <sup>30</sup> For on that day the priest shall make <sup>9</sup>atonement for you, to <sup>h</sup>cleanse you, that you may be clean from all your sins before the LORD. <sup>31</sup> <sup>i</sup>It is a sabbath of solemn rest for you, and you shall afflict your souls. It is a statute forever. <sup>32</sup> <sup>j</sup>And the priest, who is anointed and <sup>k</sup>consecrated to minister as priest in his father’s place, shall make atonement, and put on the linen clothes, the holy garments; <sup>33</sup> then he shall make <sup>1</sup>atonement for <sup>2</sup>the Holy Sanctuary, and he shall make atonement for the tabernacle of meeting and for the altar, and he shall make atonement for the priests and for all the people of the assembly. <sup>34</sup> <sup>l</sup>This shall be an everlasting statute for you, to make atonement for the children of Israel, for all their sins, <sup>m</sup>once a year.” And he did as the LORD commanded Moses.*
