#### Morning Worship Service:

Ruth 2:8-13

### **Finding Favor**

- 1. Listen to Boaz & Ruth's Conversation.
  - A. Boaz Encourages Ruth to Stay (8-9).
  - B. Ruth Asks Clarifying Questions (10).
  - C. Boaz Praises and Blesses Ruth (11-12).
  - D. Ruth Acknowledges His Kindness (13).
- 2. Boaz Is Revealed as a Means of God's Provision.
- 3. Ruth Demonstrates Wisdom.
- 4. God Continues to Care For His People.

Conclusion: God has providentially brought Ruth and Boaz together and enabled Boaz to act honorably towards her. Now Boaz and Ruth talk with one another directly for the first time and Boaz makes his favor towards her explicit and encourages her to stay in his field. Ruth clarifies his intent and thanks him graciously. This conversation raises the question if there is anything more here than hospitality and anticipates what God might do. Are we trusting God with this kind of hopeful anticipation?

#### Isaiah 55:10-11

"For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it."

#### **Second Corinthians 5:1-5**

For we know that if the tent that is our earthly home is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. <sup>2</sup> For in this tent we groan, longing to put on our heavenly dwelling, <sup>3</sup> if indeed by putting it on we may not be found naked. <sup>4</sup> For while we are still in this tent, we groan, being burdened—not that we would be unclothed, but that we would be further clothed, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. <sup>5</sup> He who has prepared us for this very thing is God, who has given us the Spirit as a guarantee.

#### **Exodus 33:12-16**

<sup>12</sup>Moses said to the Lord, "See, you say to me, 'Bring up this people,' but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. Yet you have said, 'I know you by name, and you have also found favor in my sight.' <sup>13</sup>Now therefore, if I have found favor in your sight, please show me now your ways, that I may know you in order to find favor in your sight. Consider too that this nation is your people." <sup>14</sup> And he said, "My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest." <sup>15</sup> And he said to him, "If your presence will not go with me, do not bring us up from here. <sup>16</sup> For how shall it be known that I have found favor in your sight, I and your people? Is it not in your going with us, so that we are distinct, I and your people, from every other people on the face of the earth?"

#### Luke 2:39-40

<sup>39</sup> And when they had performed everything according to the Law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. <sup>40</sup> And the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom. And *the favor of God was upon him*.

#### **Hosea 14:9**

Whoever is wise, let him understand these things; whoever is discerning, let him know them; for the ways of the Lord are right, and the upright walk in them, but transgressors stumble in them.

#### **Deuteronomy 30:9-10**

The Lord your God will make you abundantly prosperous in all the work of your hand, in the fruit of your womb and in the fruit of your cattle and in the fruit of your ground. For the Lord will again *take delight in prospering you*, as he took delight in your fathers, <sup>10</sup> when you obey the voice of the Lord your God, to keep his commandments and his statutes that are written in this Book of the Law, *when you turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul*.

# **Taking Gathered Worship Home**

As Boaz and Ruth begin talking it becomes clear that Boaz is one of the ways God is providing for Ruth. We are left with the lingering question of to what extent? But even in this we see the loving care of Yahweh for His people of whom Ruth is now a part.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

#### **Sunday Morning**

READ Ruth 2:8-13; Isaiah 55:10-11; Second Corinthians 5:1-5; Exodus 33:12-16; Luke 2:39-40; Hosea 14:9; Deuteronomy 30:9-10. DISCUSS How does Boaz's explicit communication of favor help Ruth? How does it demonstrate God's loving care? How does Ruth's clarifying questions help? MEDITATE on Psalm 27:13-14. PRAY "Jesus, You are our Provider. Help us to see Boaz's provision and protection as a sign of Your care for us, Your People."

#### **Sunday Evening**

#### Monday

READ Ruth 2:8-13; Isaiah 55:10-11; Second Corinthians 5:1-5. DISCUSS How does God ordinarily care for us? Does His use of ordinary means imply He cares any *less* than when He does so through extraordinary means? What does our physical provision say about our spiritual future? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on **Psalm 27:13-14**. PRAY, "Father, teach us that our while our current tents are fleeting, our home with You is eternal."

#### **Tuesday**

READ Ruth 2:8-13; Second Corinthians 5:1-5; Exodus 33:12-16. DISCUSS How does God's Spirit as our guarantee address Moses' question about us finding favor with Him? SERVE by considering someone else's needs *above your own*! MEDITATE on Psalm 27:13-14. PRAY, "Lord God, You are trust-worthy in all Your promises. Teach us how to trust You together in all that Your holy Word teaches."

#### Wednesday

READ Ruth 2:8-13; Exodus 33:12-16; Luke 2:39-40. DISCUSS Why is finding favor with God such a huge deal for Moses? How do we know if we have found favor with God? SERVE by contacting someone from FCCW you haven't seen in a while. Demonstrate care for them more than yourself! MEDITATE on Psalm 27:13-14. PRAY, "Lord, thank You for all that You have done for us on the cross. Make us more and more grateful for all that You have accomplished for us."

#### **Thursday**

READ Ruth 2:8-13; Luke 2:39-40; Hosea 14:9. DISCUSS Use God's wisdom to ask clarifying questions of God in His Word as Ruth did of Boaz? How certain are you of God's promises? Have you clarified what God meant with His loving care? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on **Psalm 27:13-14**. PRAY, "Lord, help us in studying Your Word to go beneath the surface. Enable us to probe deeply into Your promises and to take You at Your Word."

#### **Friday**

READ Ruth 2:8-13; Isaiah 55:10-11; Second Corinthians 5:1-5; Exodus 33:12-16; Luke 2:39-40; Hosea 14:9; Deuteronomy 30:9-10. DISCUSS What has the Holy Spirit been teaching you this week through these passages? MEDITATE on Psalm 27:13-14. PRAY that we at FCCW would *trust You together for Your favor in Christ*.

#### **Saturday**

PREPARE for gathered worship tomorrow. READ **Ruth 2:1-23**. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the worship service @ 10:30. Ask Jesus to help us trust Him instead of giving into bitterness and doubt.

#### Psalm 27:13-14

I believe that I shall see the favor of the LORD in the land of the living!

Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!
