- ______ — This word (davar) occurs ______ times (v.9) and refers to substance/matter of something that is spoken. It is the truth that proceeds from the mouth of God. It is interesting that the *Decalogue* was the "ten things" or words of the Lord (Ex. 20.1-17). The Lord warned about adding or diminishing of His _______. (Mat. 4.4).

- _____ — This word occurs _____ times (v. 7) and refers to divine judicial decisions. His ______ system is far greater than any nation's (Deut. 4.8)
