THE SEIGE OF SAMARIA

2 Kings 6:24-33; (Lev 26:27-29; Deut 28:53-57)

I. THE DESPERATION OF THE HUMAN CONDITION (24-25)

- A. <u>War</u>—Samaria is under siege by the Syrian army
 - 1. Human conflict began at the Fall within the family.
 - 2. War is a massive, physical expression of humanity's relational dysfunction.
- B. <u>Famine</u>—so severe that people are reduced to eating dung and cannibalism
 - **1. Our fortunes can change very quickly**. (Zeph 1:18)
 - 2. Famine is a manifestation of the curse that Adam brought upon the earth.
- II. THE REASON FOR THE SITUATION (Amos 3:6)
 - A. <u>The Curse for Breaking Covenant</u> (Lev 26:27-29; Deut 28:53-57)—it fits the crime
 - B. <u>The Depth of Human Depravity</u> (Jer 19:4-9; 32:35)
 - **1.** The <u>Sacrifice of Children</u> to an Idol—the most depraved worship imaginable
 - 2. The <u>Cannibalism of Parents</u> in Famine—the most depraved loss of humanity

III. THE KING'S RESPONSE TO THE SITUATION

A. <u>Distress</u> (30)—wearing sackcloth under his clothing

- B. Blaming the Prophet (31; Ps 69:9; Jn 5:20)—off with his head!
- C. <u>Blaming the LORD</u> (33a; Prov 19:3; Rev 16:11)—"This trouble is from the LORD!"
- D. Despair (33b; Ps 27:13-14)—"Why should I wait for the LORD any longer?"

IV. OUR RESPONSE TO THE SITUATION

- A. <u>Called to Trust God</u> (Ps 27:14; 71:1; Lam 3:26; Is 28:16; Rom 10:11;)—wait for the LORD
- **B.** <u>Called to Witness</u> (Acts 1:8)—persecution spread the church, gave platform to witness; by the power of the Holy Spirit.
- C. <u>Called to Rejoice in the LORD</u> (Ps 63:3; Hab 3:17-18; Phil 4:4)
