
Missionary of the Month AMAZING GRACE


His word goes forth, and people by its might Once more their freedom gain from degradation, Humanity doth give to each his right, While those in darkness find restored the light.

The Triumphal and Tragic Entry

How could Jesus' entry be both triumphal and tragic?

It was triumphal because Jesus arranged His entry into Jerusalem on this occasion to openly show Himself as the Messiah coming to be King - **Matthew 21:1–11**

- Jesus fulfilled the prophecy of Zechariah 9:9 Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your King is coming to you; He is just and having salvation, Lowly and riding on a donkey, A colt, the foal of a donkey.
- A king coming on a horse represented a conquering king. A king coming on a donkey signified a king coming in peace.
- The donkey shows the humility of the King. He is not concerned with worldly pomp, ambition, or power.
- It was tragic because people did not fully comprehend who Jesus was.

It was triumphal because the people openly worshiped Jesus as the Messiah (Christ), the Son of David, King of Israel - **Mark 11:1–11**

- The spreading of clothes and branches on the road paved a receptive path for royalty (like the red carpet).
- The palm branches celebrated the kingdom of Israel and the Feast of Tabernacles.
- The people shouted *Hosanna* (save now) *in the highest* (to be heard in heaven).
- The Hallel (praise psalms) are recited at the Jewish Feasts (Psalms 113-118).
- The people applied the Messianic portion of the Hallel to Jesus Psalm 118:25–26
- It was tragic because there were no voices of blessing for Jesus from the temple.

It was triumphal because Jesus fulfilled the Messianic prophetic timing - Luke 19:28-44

- Jesus fulfilled Daniel's prophecy of the timing of the Messiah's coming at the end of the sixty-ninth week - Daniel 9:25 Know therefore and understand, That from the going forth of the command to restore and build Jerusalem until Messiah the Prince, There shall be seven weeks and sixty-two weeks
- It was tragic because the religious leaders rejected Jesus.

It was triumphal because Jesus entered Jerusalem to die - John 12:1-26

- It was tragic because Jesus entered Jerusalem not with the anointing of a king but with an anointing for death John 19:14–16
- Jesus came to earth to die for sin John 12:23, 27–28, 32; John 1:29 The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!

The entry of Jesus into Jerusalem was tragic because He was put to death. The entry of Jesus into Jerusalem was triumphal because God was glorified through His death!
