John 19:17,18 THE PLACE OF A SKULL: GOLGOTHA

What is seen.

- A. He was led out of the city to the place called Golgotha, near a major intersection of roads.
 - 1. He was taken out of the city to a hill which was likely shaped as a human skull.
 - 2. The soldiers took a shovel, hammer, nails, jug of myrrh (wine with a sedative) and two beams.
- B. Many physical things happened: three men experienced the cruelty and hatred of men, being nailed to a wooden cross.
- C. Jesus was crucified "in the midst," i.e., with two others, both evil-doers.
 - 1. He is identified/numbered with the transgressors (Isaiah 53:12) because He entered into our state guilt.
 - 2. Jesus' cross divides them.

II. What is not seen.

- A. Jesus "went forth" thought they "led Him" to this place.
 - 1. First, this shows that Jesus was not the victim but the Master in control of every circumstance.
 - 2. And this shows that this was according to the determinate counsel and foreknowledge of God (Acts 2:23).
- B. Only by a work of God's grace can we see the spiritual realities behind the physical sight.

III. The significance

- A. Jesus is in the midst of evil-doers because this is the only way to pay for our sins.
 - 1. Golgotha happened because it was the only way to remove forever the sins of God's elect.
 - 2. The Son of God, for all His people, goes under the darkness of eternal death and makes His soul an offering for sin.
- B. What does it mean to you? We will spend all eternity recounting what it means.
