Live for God's Glory

1 Corinthians 10:31 (LEB)

Therefore, whether you eat or you drink or whatever you do, do all things for the glory of God,

- This summarizes the key issues of 8:1-11:1
- False knowledge, dining with demons in the idol temple, etc. do not glorify God
- "Do" is the first of three imperatives in this section

Do Not Cause Anyone to Stumble

1 Corinthians 10:32 (LEB)

Give no offense both to Jews and to Greeks and to the church of God,

- The practices Paul wrote to correct did not glorify God and did harm others
- The word translated 'no offense' means blameless, or undamaged
- Thiselton translates "avoid doing damage"
- These 3 categories of people describe 'all'
- "Greeks" here means non-Jewish pagans

Paul Sought the Benefit of Others

1 Corinthians 10:33 (LEB)

just as I also please all people in all things, not seeking my own benefit, but the benefit of the many, in order that they may be saved.

- 'in order that' (Gr. hina) is a purpose clause
- Salvation from God's wrath is the greatest possible benefit
- 'Benefit' is sumphoros which can also be translated 'advantage'

Paul Imitated Christ We Must as Well

1 Corinthians 11:1 (LEB)

Become imitators of me, just as I also am of Christ.

- 'Become' is imperative in the Greek
- The issue is placing the welfare of others before one's own self-interest
- 10:33 mentioned the "benefit of many"
- Christ gave Himself for many (Is. 53:11, 12)

Isaiah 53:5 (NASB)

But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; The chastening for our wellbeing fell upon Him, And by His scourging we are healed.

Isaiah 53:11 (HCSB)

He will see it out of His anguish, and He will be satisfied with His knowledge. My righteous Servant will justify many, and He will carry their iniquities.
