The Westminster Shorter Catechism

Q.101: What do we pray for in the first petition?

A.101: In the first petition, which is, “*Hallowed be Your name,*” we pray that God would enable us and others to glorify Him in all that by which He makes himself known; and that He would work all things to His own glory.

Q.102: What do we pray for in the second petition?

A.102: In the second petition, which is, “*Your kingdom come,*” we pray that Satan’s kingdom may be destroyed; and that the kingdom of grace may be advanced, ourselves and others brought into it, and kept in it; and that the kingdom of glory may come soon.

Q.103: What do we pray for in the third petition?

A.103: In the third petition, which is, “*Your will be done in earth, as it is in heaven,*” we pray that God, by His grace, would make us able and willing to know, obey, and submit to His will in all things, as the angels do in heaven.

Q.104: What do we pray for in the fourth petition?

A.104: In the fourth petition, which is, “*Give us this day our daily bread,*” we pray that by God’s free gift we may receive a sufficient portion of the good things of this life, and enjoy His blessing with them.

Q.105: What do we pray for in the fifth petition?

A.105: In the fifth petition, which is, “*And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors,*” we pray that God, for Christ’s sake, would freely pardon all our sins; for which we are greatly encouraged to ask, because by His grace we are enabled from the heart to forgive others.

Q.106: What do we pray for in the sixth petition?

A.106: In the sixth petition, which is, “*And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one,*” we pray that God would either keep us from being tempted to sin, or support and deliver us when we are tempted.

LORD’S SUPPER PREPARATION

Lord willing we will again have the joy of celebrating the Lord’s Supper next Sunday. In the name of our Lord we therefore call upon members to examine themselves and to prepare this week to come to this Supper in full assurance of faith, (1) believing that they are “worthy” to partake because of Jesus Christ and His suffering and death in their place, and (2) purposing to live their daily lives for His glory, by obeying all that He commands.

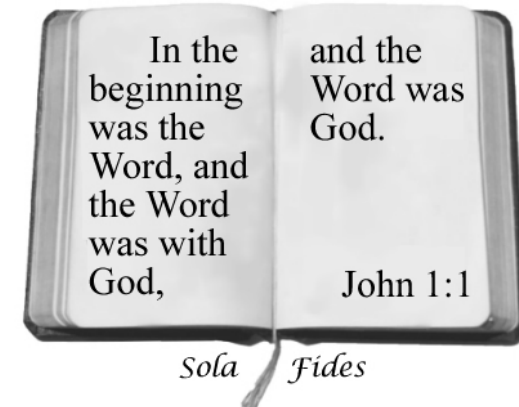
