- **ESV**, Be not quick in your spirit to become angry, for anger lodges in the heart of fools.
- **KJV**, Be not hasty in thy spirit to be angry: for anger resteth in the bosom of fools.
- **JPS**, Don't let your spirit be quickly vexed, for vexation abides in the breast of fools.

## F. conclusions

- 1. Anger is common to all human beings.
- 2. Anger is an intimate and abiding characteristic of fools.
- 3. Anger unchecked fails to submit to a sovereign God.
- 4. Abiding anger presents a poor testimony of Christian confession.
- 5. How is anger remedied?
  - a. "Is my anger Christlike?"
  - b. "Is Christ exalted when I'm angry?"
  - c. When I learn to become quick to hear (God's Word) & slow to speak (my opinions from the flesh, but meditate upon what God has spoken in His Word), I will become slow to anger.
