Mark 12:38-44 — "Judgment Comes Upon False Teachers & Oppressors of the Weak"

Satan's greatest ambassadors are not pimps, politicians, or power-brokers, but pastors. His priests do not peddle a different religion, but a deadly perversion of the true one. His troops do not make a full-out frontal assault, but work as agents, sneaking into the opposing army. Satan's tactics are studied, clever, predictable, effective. Therefore, we must always remain vigilant. "Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. Background to Mark 12:38-44 (parallel Matthew 23)

- The question for us: Given Sunday (Hosanna! The JOY!), then why Friday (Crucify him! the hate!)?
 - **Answer**: Monday & Tuesday
 - Monday clear the Temple
 - Tuesday all the dialogues/debates/the teachings in the Temple courts = the claims!
- What made the Jewish leaders so infuriated?
 - JESUS WAS TEACHING TRUTH ...
 - ✓ EXCLUSIVE WAY TO HEAVEN!
 - ✓ EXPOSING THE EVILS OF FALSE TEACHERS!
 - ✓ EXHORTING THEM TO TRUST & FOLLOW HIM!
 - ✓ EXPLAINING THE GLORY OF SCRIPTURE & HOW JESUS FULFILLS IT
 - ✓ EXCLAIMED THE HOTTEST HELL RESERVED FOR THEM!

I. <u>JESUS CONDEMNS FALSE TEACHERS!</u> They'll have a greater condemnation in hell (38-40)

- ⇒ this is the *heartless greed* of the scribes
- what makes God mad? Those who pervert God's Word, distort truth, propagate lies & lead others astray.

Mark 12:38-44 — "Judgment Comes Upon False Teachers & Oppressors of the Weak"

Mark 12 is parallel with Matthew 23 (Matt 23 provides much more of the scathing rebukes & the 8 Woe judgments)

Matt 23:1-10: Jesus exposes the evils of these false teachers & why they deserve 'greater condemnation':

- 1. SELF APPOINTED AUTHORITY (2) (he lacks true authority)
- 2. HYPOCRITICAL DEMANDS (lack integrity) (3)
- 3. LOVELESS & UNCARING (4) (lacks sympathy)
- 4. PRETENTIOUS DISPLAYS (5) (lacks authenticity)
- 5. PROUD & ARROGANT (6-7) (lacks humility)

The 8 "Woe" judgments Jesus pronounces are public, scathing, truthful and, really, 'signing his own death warrant'. A "woe" judgment is like a 'funeral lament' (e.g., you're as good as dead; divine judgment upon you)

Matthew 23 — THE WOE JUDGMENTS — all 8 OF THEM.

- I. Matt 23.13 Woe to those who shut up the kingdom. (they EXCLUDE people) the heart problem? = THEY DON'T LIKETHE GOSPEL (I Thess 2.14-16)
- 2. Matt 23.14 The religious leaders steal from the vulnerable. (Greedy) the heart problem? THEY ARE GREEDY (Jude 16)
- 3. Matt 23.15 The religious leaders led their converts on the wrong path. (they are guilty of SUBVERSION) the heart problem? THEY ARE SELF-MADE GODS: WANTING TO MAKE CONVERTS TO THEIR SECT NOT GODS
- 4. Matt 23.16-22 The religious leaders made false and deceptive oaths. (they PERVERT the Truth) the heart problem? THEY ARE WILLING TO LIE TO GET WHAT THEY WANT. (trying to justify it)
- 5. Matt 23.23-24 The religious leaders are obsessed with trivialities, and ignoring the weighty matters.
- What does GOD want? Micah 6.8 do justice, love kindness, walk humbly with your God.
- 6. Matt 23.25-26 The religious leaders are impure both inside and out. (they care for self)
- 7. Matt 23.27-28 The religious leaders have the appearance of good, but without spiritual life in the inner man. what's ironic: the very men who prided themselves that they were Lawkeepers are now condemned as LAWLESS.
- 8. Matt 23.29-36 The religious leaders honor dead prophets, but murder the living prophets. The very (blind) prophets who pretend to honor the dead prophets, could see no beauty in a living Christ & wanted to kill him too!

"This doctrine is indeed awful and dreadful yet 'tis of God." (John Gerstner)

Throughout the history of redemption, the greatest threat to God's truth and God's work has been false prophets and teachers, because they propose to speak in His name. That is why the Lord's most scathing denunciations were reserved for the false teachers of Israel, who claimed to speak and act for God but were liars. His last sermon (Matt. 23) consists almost entirely of warnings about them and to them. Matthew 23 is one of the most serious passages in Scripture. Jesus here makes the word hypocrite a synonym for scribe and for Pharisee. He calls them sons of hell, blind guides, fools, robbers, self-indulgent, whitewashed tombs, full of hypocrisy and lawlessness, serpents, vipers, and persecutors and murderers of God's people. He uttered every syllable with absolute self-control but with devastating intensity. (John MacArthur)

II. <u>JESUS EXPOSES THEIR EVIL GREED!</u> They steal from the poor for their own selfish gain (41-44)

⇒ this is the *heartfelt giving* of the widow

A. **CONDEMNATION** of the Leaders:

B. <u>COMMENDATION</u> of the Widow:
