Believe the Resurrection John 20:1–31

The disciples went through the process and journey of coming to faith. They were called upon to believe the word of God through the testimony of others.

Matthew's account confronts the denial of the resurrection - Matthew 28:1–20 Mark's account exposes the fear and unbelief of the resurrection Mark 16:1–20 Luke's account challenges the difficulty of accepting the resurrection - Luke 24:1–43 John's account encourages faith in the resurrection - John 20:1–31

Peter and John believed when they saw the empty tomb - John 20:1–10 *v*. *1* - Mary and the women were the first to see the empty tomb - Matthew 28:5–6 *v*. *2*–10 - Peter and John believed the tomb was empty.

Mary believed when she saw Jesus - John 20:11–18

v. 11–15 - Mary could not recognize Jesus.

v. 16–17 - Jesus revealed Himself to her - 2 Corinthians 5:16–17 Therefore, from now on, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we have known Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know Him thus no longer. Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new.

v. 18 - Mary told the disciples of Jesus resurrection - Mark 16:9–11

The disciples believed when they saw Jesus - John 20:19-23

v. 19–20 - Jesus revealed Himself to the disciples - Luke 24:36–43; Acts 1:3 to whom He also presented Himself alive after His suffering by many infallible proofs, being seen by them during forty days and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God.

v. 21 - Jesus sent out His disciples.

v. 22 - Jesus promised His giving of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2).

v. 23 - Jesus commissioned His disciples, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to continue His ministry of preaching the gospel - John 3:36 He who believes in the Son has everlasting life; and he who does not believe the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him; Colossians 1:14 in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins; Acts 13:38 Therefore let it be known to you, brethren, that through this Man is preached to you the forgiveness of sins;

Thomas believed when he saw Jesus - John 20:24-29

v. 24–25 - Thomas was no more a doubter than the others.

v. 26-28 - Jesus revealed Himself to Thomas.

v. 29 - Jesus pronounces a blessing upon those who believe without seeing.

Jesus Christ has revealed Himself to us. Will you believe?

John 20:30–31 And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name.
