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Olive Tree Interpretation

Premillennial: Nation of Israel will be restored

- 1. Natural branches: non-elect Israelites
- 2. Wild Olive shoot: elect Gentiles
- 3. Cultivated Olive Tree: Israel (Gentiles too!)
- 4. Rich root: Patriarchs and promises

Some Amillennnialists: The church is Israel

- 1. Natural branches: non-elect Israelites
- 2. Wild Olive shoot: elect Gentiles
- 3. Cultivated Olive Tree: Israel (Gentiles too!)
- 4. Rich root: Jesus

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Context for Romans 11:17

Romans 11:13-15

But I am speaking to you who are Gentiles. Inasmuch then as I am an apostle of Gentiles, I magnify my ministry, 14 if somehow I might move to jealousy my fellow countrymen and save some of them. 15 For if their rejection is the reconciliation of the world, what will their acceptance be but life from the dead?

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What Is the Root?

Romans 11:16-18

If the first piece of dough is holy, the lump is also; and if the root is holy, the branches are too. 17 But if some of the branches were broken off, and you, being a wild olive, were grafted in among them and became partaker with them of the rich root of the olive tree, 18 do not be arrogant toward the branches; but if you are arrogant, remember that it is not you who supports the root, but the root supports you.

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What Makes More Sense?

Romans 11:17–18 But if some of the branches were broken off, and you, being a wild olive, were grafted in among them and became partaker with them of the rich root of the olive tree, 18 do not be arrogant toward the branches; but if you are arrogant, remember that it is not you who supports the root, but the root supports you.

Amillennial: "...it is not you who supports Jesus, but Jesus supports you."

Premillennial: "...it is not you who supports the promises given to the patriarchs, but the patriarchs' promises support you."

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God Is Able

Romans 11:19-23

You will say then, "Branches were broken off so that I might be grafted in." 20 Quite right, they were broken off for their unbelief, but you stand by your faith. Do not be conceited, but fear; 21 for if God did not spare the natural branches, He will not spare you, either. 22 Behold then the kindness and severity of God; to those who fell, severity, but to you, God's kindness, if you continue in His kindness; otherwise you also will be cut off. 23 And they also, if they do not continue in their unbelief, will be grafted in, for God is able to graft them in again.

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Why This Matters

Romans 11:24–26 For if you were cut off from what is by nature a wild olive tree, and were grafted contrary to nature into a cultivated olive tree, how much more will these who are the natural branches be grafted into their own olive tree? 25 For I do not want you, brethren, to be uninformed of this mystery—so that you will not be wise in your own estimation—that a partial hardening has happened to Israel until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in; 26 and so all Israel will be saved; just as it is written, "The Deliverer will come from Zion, He will remove ungodliness from Jacob."

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How Is This a Mystery?

Amillennial:

For I do not want you, brethren, to be uninformed of this mystery—so that you will not be wise in your own estimation—that a partial hardening has happened to church until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in; 26 and so all the church will be saved; just as it is written, "The Deliverer will come from Zion, He will remove ungodliness from the church."
