Mark 12:18-27 — "Jesus Speaks Afterlife Truth to Mocking, Religious Liberals"

Do you ever ponder these questions?

- ✓ Is there even a resurrection from the dead? What's the afterlife like?
- ✓ What about the age to come? What's it like? Is it similar to the way things currently are?
- ✓ What will I be like? Will I have gender? Personality? Uniqueness? Identity?
- ✓ How will we be like the angels? What will worship-filled life look like?
- ✓ What about relationships What about my marriage, my spouse and my companionships?
- ✓ What about my close relationships, friendships, family ties ... what will happen to them?
- ✓ What about my worship and devotion to God...what will it be like?

To go to heaven, fully to enjoy God, is infinitely better than the most pleasant accommodations here. Better than fathers and mothers, husbands, wives, or children, or the company of any, or all earthly friends. These are but shadows; but the enjoyment of God is the substance. These are but scattered beams; but God is the sun. These are but streams; but God is the fountain. These are but drops, but God is the ocean. (Jonathan Edwards)

1. **a theological answer** - in resurrection, we are like angels (v.25)

2. **an exegetical answer** - in the Burning Bush text: God IS God of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob (v.26-27)

The point? There IS an afterlife. You better prepare now.

Some Theological Points:

- 1. Marriage is a God-given institution for this age only (25a).
- 2. There is still gender, identity, personality & uniqueness in heaven. (26b)
- 3. All in heaven will never die again but will live eternally (26b)
- 4. All in heaven are like the angels in total dedication to God in worship (25b)
- 5. Marriage in this life is swallowed up in the ultimate marriage with Christ in the next.
 - >> So Jesus answers *theologically* & shows their faulty presuppositions/assumptions.

Some Additional Points from the Text:

- 1. There IS an afterlife/age to come (v.25 for WHEN they shall rise)
- 2. Heaven is *NOT* just a continuation of how things currently are. (v.25a)
- 3. Those in glory have gender, identity, personality, uniqueness (v.26b—masculine)
- 4. Those in glory are alive with fullness of life & communion with God, never to die again (v.27a)
- 5. There will be no marriage but there will be close relationships, memory and togetherness (v.25-26)
- 6. Worship and devotion to God will be supremely satisfying, infinitely enjoyable, never-ending in the immediate presence of the blazing holiness of God. (v.25b like the angels; cf. Isa 6; Rev 7.11 angels fell on faces and worshiped God)
- 7. Heaven is the ultimate possession of and enjoyment of & worship of the Triune-God. (v.26b-I am the God of...- the phrase "the GOD OF" in Greek signifies intimacy in relationship).

My Soul, you shall swim in happiness, you shall dive in seas of inconceivable delight by reason of your union with Christ and your delight in Him and His delight in you! I know no better idea of Heaven than to be eternally content with Christ and Christ to be eternally content with me! And all this will happen within a very little time. Therefore, lay aside your cares, dismiss your fears, murmur no more. Such a destiny awaits you that you may well be content. (Charles Spurgeon)
