

David Spared Saul 1 Samuel 24:1–22

The Lord vindicated David before Saul - Psalm 54:1 Save me, O God, by Your name, And vindicate me by Your strength.

v. 1–3 - God is in sovereign control over each and every circumstance of life.

v. 4-7 - David spares Saul's life.

- Judging by the circumstances alone, David's men appeared to be correct.
- Cutting Saul's robe was a serious offense
- The torn robe disqualified Saul as an Israelite Numbers 15:37–41
- The torn robe symbolically deposed Saul as king—tearing away his royalty 1 Samuel
 15:28 So Samuel said to him, "The LORD has torn the kingdom of Israel from you today, and has given it to a neighbor of yours, who is better than you.
- David was convicted of sin Exodus 22:28 You shall not revile God, nor curse a ruler of your people.
- David properly interpreted God's promise to mean that he would have to wait upon God to remove Saul - 1 Samuel 16:1; 20:15
- David would not kill Saul and take the throne by his own power.

v. 8–15 - David speaks to Saul.

- David argued for his innocence.
- David showed every respect to King Saul (8).
- David, respectfully, did not directly accuse Saul (9).
- David explained his motive for not harming Saul (10).
- David provided the material evidence that he would not harm Saul (11).
- David argued for his innocence by appealing to divine and moral justice (12–13).
- David challenged Saul to see that chasing him was foolish (14).
- David pleaded with Saul to do right before the Lord (15) Exodus 23:7 Keep yourself far from a false matter; do not kill the innocent and righteous. For I will not justify the wicked.

v. 16-22 - Saul speaks to David.

- Saul was a broken man (16).
- Saul was a shamed man (17).
- Saul was a defeated man (18–19).
- Saul was an evil man who fully understood his actions and consequences (20).
- Jonathan made a covenant of life by joining with David he gained life for his descendants (20:14–17); Saul made David take an oath in death not to destroy the memory of his name (21–22).

David had won many battles, but one of his greatest victories occurred in that cave when he restrained himself and his men from killing Saul. "He who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, And he who rules his spirit than he who takes a city." (Proverbs 16:32). This is a good example for all of us to follow, but especially those to whom the Lord has entrusted leadership. Warren Wiersbe; The Wiersby Bible Old Testament Commentary
