Introduction:

Could they have been early Christian documents, perhaps collections of sayings of Jesus or early versions of Christian preaching or Old Testament exegesis? Could these have been the materials Luke and Mark used later to put together their Gospel accounts? We do not know, but it is not a completely implausible hypothesis...that they contained early Christian literature—either of Paul's own manuscripts or the sayings of Jesus or primitive accounts of the Lord's life prior to the four Gospel writers....Was Paul deliberately interested in a written record of Christ's life? Would not this be consistent with the central theme of the Pastorals—to guard the deposit of the gospel?
