Sermon Outline for Sunday, February 16, 2020

"Be Careful What You Wish For!" Habakkuk Part 8

**I Text:**

Old Covenant: *Habakkuk 3:7-16*

New Covenant: *Luke 1:46-56*

**II Doctrine:** Habakkuk continues with the prayer to be sung and memorized by the people. He reminds the Hebrews of their covenant history. From Joshua to Gideon the Lord always provides a deliverer to miraculously rescue his people from judgment. The living God brought his people into the promised land with Jesus Christ. God often allows the enemies of his people to destroy themselves. Habakkuk was fearfully reverent in his remembrance of God's power. Witnessing the miraculous power of God through history we should all fall on our knees in fearful reverence.

**III Comparing Scripture With Scripture:**

1) Habakkuk continues with the prayer to be sung and memorized by the people. He reminds the Hebrews of their covenant history. From Joshua to Gideon the Lord always provides a deliverer to miraculously rescue his people from judgment. (*Habakkuk 3:7-12; Joshua 10:12-15; Judges 7:1-3*)

2) The living God brought his people into the promised land with Jesus Christ. God often allows the enemies of his people to destroy themselves. (*Habakkuk 3:13-15; 1Corinthians 10:1-5; Judges 7:19-23*)

3) Habakkuk was fearfully reverent in his remembrance of God's power. Witnessing the miraculous power of God through history we should all fall on our knees in fearful reverence. (*Habakkuk 3:16; 1Corinthians 10:6-13*)

**Proverbs 9:10-12**

*10The fear of the LORD [is] the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy [is] understanding.*

*11For by me thy days shall be multiplied, and the years of thy life shall be increased.*

*12If thou be wise, thou shalt be wise for thyself: but [if] thou scornest, thou alone shalt bear [it].*
