# GOING THROUGH SAMARIA

APPLICATION QUESTIONS: WEEK OF MARCH 6, 2022.

Study of John / John 4:1-42

#### Introduction:

A few weeks ago, we read about Jesus in Jerusalem talking to Nicodemus. Now, He comes to Samaria and speaks to a Samaritan woman about salvation. It is interesting to note the differences between these two:

- 1. **Nicodemus** was a Jewish leader, a scholar, and a moral man. The **Samaritan woman** was immoral, of a poor reputation in her town, and was ignorant of spiritual truth.
- 2. **Nicodemus** came to Jesus to ask questions. Jesus came to the **Samaritan woman** to ask questions.
- 3. So far as we can tell, **Nicodemus** did not get saved when he met with Jesus. The **Samaritan** woman believed and was saved.

Why do you think the Samaritan woman responded to the Gospel the first time she met Jesus while Nicodemus did not?
