A. Jesus Coming into His Own (4:12)

I. Jesus Begins to Herald the Kingdom of Darkness-Piercing Light

- A. Jesus settles in Capernaum, sets up his headquarters there and fulfills a prophecy (Isa 9:1–2)
 - 1. Double fulfillment
- B. The Reality of Light Piercing Darkness comes to us through Preaching
 - 1. Twofold purpose
 - a. Summarizing the beginning of Jesus' ministry.
 - b. The <u>preaching</u> of repentance unto the entrance of the Kingdom of God is the <u>vehicle</u> through which the light pierces the darkness

II. The Church's Mission to Pierce the Darkness with the Light of the Kingdom

- A. Our Union with Christ pierces the Darkness of delusion, depravity, and despondency
- B. Darkness Piercing Light Comes in a Kingdom
- C. Darkness Piercing Light Comes through Repentance
- D. The Way of Kingdom Repentance is *marked by Rejection*

- 4. Why is the *kingdom* such an important part of the darkness-piercing light of the gospel?
- 5. Why is repentance (for both believers and unbelievers) such an important part of the message of the kingdom?
- 6. In what sense can people's *rejection* of our message of repentance be comforting?
- 7. How can we become overly man-centered when it comes to calling people to repentance? What is the remedy to this?
