FURTHER CONSIDERATIONS

Ephesians 2:1-3

How do these verses describe the condition of each person before salvation? What specific characteristics of the spiritually dead are mentioned? What specific areas of spiritual struggle are mentioned? What can a dead person do to save himself? How does Jeremiah 13:23 illustrate the truth in this person?

Ephesians 2:4-10

What is the emphasis in these verses? How does the hopelessness of the opening verses of chapter 2 highlight the mercy of God? What can a person contribute to their own salvation? Why is salvation by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone? How did you walk before salvation (v. 2)? How are you to walk after salvation (v. 10)?

Ephesians 1:19-23

How does this passage set the stage for what comes in chapter 2? How is God's power evidenced in both sections? How does humanity's hopeless condition in 2:1-3 highlight God's love? How should understanding the condition of unsaved people motivate you to share the Gospel? Whom are you praying for, that they would be saved? Will you pray for an opportunity to share the hope of God's love and mercy?
