Message #2: The Grain or Meal Offering (Leviticus 2: 1-16)

- 1. First half of Leviticus: Old Testament believer how to approach God.
- 2. Second half: Tells the Old Testament believer how to walk with God.
- Leviticus two very essential things: Always a sacrifice, Always a priest
  I. How is the Meal Offering Related to the Burnt Offering
- Burnt offering &/grain offering often together (Num. 15:1–16; 28; Josh. 22:23; 1 Sam. 1:24; 1 Kings 8:64; 2 Kings 16:13, 15)
- Fitting for those who received atonement to express dedication to God
  II. Central Theme of the Grain Offering
- Dedication follows at nement free from corruption and contamination
- God required a memorial, a token demonstrating His bountiful goodness
- III. Express Dedication to Yahweh: offering a token of substance (1,4,14)
  - A. God's people are to honor Jehovah with His bounteous Provisions
  - B. Tribute that God's People are to bring is a Portion of their Substance
    - i. Cooked
    - ii. Uncooked
    - iii. First fruits
- IV. Grain Offering: no Corruption & Faithful to Covenant (4-7, 11-13, 15)
  - A. YHWH Desires Dedication without Corruption
  - B. YHWH Desires Covenant Faithfulness
    - V. YHWH is Pleased to Receive A Memorial of Our Dedication
- A. The Meal Offering Served as a Memorial
- B. The Memorial Offering is Pleasing to YHWH
- C. The Grain or Meal Offering is Most Holy
