Healing

- Penance (also “Reconciliation” and “Confession”)
 - Mortal (grave matter, full knowledge, deliberate consent) vs. venial sin.
 - Confession, Contrition (the penitent), Prayer of Absolution, Assignment of Penance/Satisfaction (the priest)
 - ❖ Authoritative Catholic dogma requires penance at least once a year for grave sins (Can. 989).
- Anointing of the Sick (also Extreme Unction/Last Rites)

Service

- Holy Orders (priesthood, clerical celibacy)
- Matrimony (marriage)
