Great Themes in Isaiah

"The Holiness of God"

Isaiah 6:1-8

Introduction:

- I. We need to see <u>GOD</u> for Who He is (v.1-4) (Isaiah sees God for Who He is)
 - 1) He is a God of <u>Majestic Holiness</u> (v.1)
 - a) He is an eternal King
 - b) He is an exalted King
 - 2) He is a God of Moral Holiness (v.2-4)
 - a) The seraphim's eyes are not worthy to <u>see</u>
 - b) The seraphim's feet are not worthy to serve
- II. We need to see <u>OURSELVES</u> as we really are (v.5-7) (Isaiah sees Himself for who he is)
 - 1) God's holiness reveals an <u>accurate perspective of self</u> (v.5)
 - 2) God's holiness requires an <u>atoning provision for sin</u> (v.6-7)
- III. We need to be <u>CLEAN</u> before we can serve God acceptably (v.8) (Isaiah is now ready and willing to serve God)
