II. The Prodigal Prophet Preaches (Jonah 3:2-4)

- A. The prodigal prophet returns to his calling to preach (2:2)
 - 1. The message (in Greek *kerygma*)
 - 2. Three days of preaching through the city (2:3-4)
- B. Yet forty days and Nineveh shall be overthrown! A simple message
 - 1. The Gospel is our simple message
 - a. once-delivered, unto salvation (Jude 3, Ro 1:17)
 - b. the content of the Gospel kerygma (1 Co 15:3-5)
 - c. the Gospel must be received (1 Co 15:1-2)
 - d. a call to repentance and faith (Mk 1:14-15, Acts 2:38/16:31, Acts 10:38/11:18, John 3:16/2 Pet 3:9 John 3:36, 5:24-25, 6:40, 6:47, 11:25-26, Mk 16:16, Rom 10:9-10 and 1 Jn 5:11-13/ Lk 15:10, Acts 17:30
 - 2. Simply preach the Gospel in simplicity (1 Co 2:1-5)
 - a. This does not mean an a-doctrinal message
 - b. preach Christ crucified and risen (1 Co 1:23)
- C. Forty days and Nineveh shall be overthrown! An offensive message
 - 1. People must know what they are saved from
 - a. the use of the law to point out sin and drive to Christ
 - b. the fear of the Lord motivates us to preach (2 Cor 5:11)
 - c. the gospel is a foolish message (1 Cor 1:21)
- D. Forty days and Nineveh shall be overthrown! A hopeful message?
 - 1. How did the people of Nineveh have any hope?
 - a. The 40 day time period suggests time for God to reconsider
 - b. Is there any hope in the word "*overthrown*." (Dt 23:5)
 - c. Jonah himself brought them hope from his own brokenness
 - 2. Preach the Gospel out of love (Phil 1:15-17)
- E. Forty days and Nineveh shall be overthrown! An **urgent** message
 - 1. Jonah preached with conviction as a man who had been there
 - 2. We need a return to preaching with Biblical passion (1 Cor 2:4)
 - a. this was the secret to revival in the early church (Acts 4:31)
 - b. Please pray for unction in our preaching (2Th 3:1, Eph 6:19)

III. Preaching leads to Prodigal Repentance (Jonah 3:5-9)

- A. Unbelievable repentance!
- B. Similar report of prodigal repentance from Northern Ireland
- C. This is the kind of revival we need!
- D. Therefore Go! (Mt 28:19-20)
