III. He is the One to Whom we are _____

(1:18b)

Jesus is the One who is the steward of eternity. The fact that He has the keys means that He is the One who has authority. *"Keys"* means authority and power. In Scripture a key is a sign of authority and power. This means He is the Lord over physical death which terminates life in this world. By His death for sin and His resurrection, Christ has pulled from Satan's hands any authority the devil had over death (cf. Heb. 2:14-15). He is also the Sovereign over life after death. He has the power over our eternal destiny. He has the authority to unlock death and Hades. Those terms are essentially synonymous, with death being the condition and Hades the place.
